POLICE REPRESENTATIONS TO LICENSING ACT 2003 APPLICATION.**RE: Crewe & Harpur, Swarkestone.****PRIVATE AND CONFIDENTIAL****PLEASE NOTE:**

The information contained in this letter does not form part of the 'Notice of Police representation'.

Please disclose to the Licensing Authority/ Licensing Committee and Applicants only at this stage.

Disclosure to other parties prior to hearing may prejudice any alternative dispute resolution process and subsequent committee hearing / court appeal.

The Police have no issues with the proposed opening times of these premises, however:

The Association of Chief Police Officers (ACPO) recommends that only 12 "discretionary" events should be permitted, for which the police must be notified in writing not less than 14 days before the event, and that police shall have absolute veto over any events that are likely to impact on the four licensing objectives.

With regard to the premises being permitted to open for licensable activities to show the broadcast of sporting events of national or international interest outside normal operating hours, it is felt that these should be included in with the "discretionary" events.

If the application is amended to reflect the above, then the police will be in a position to withdraw the objection, thereby negating the need for a formal committee hearing.
