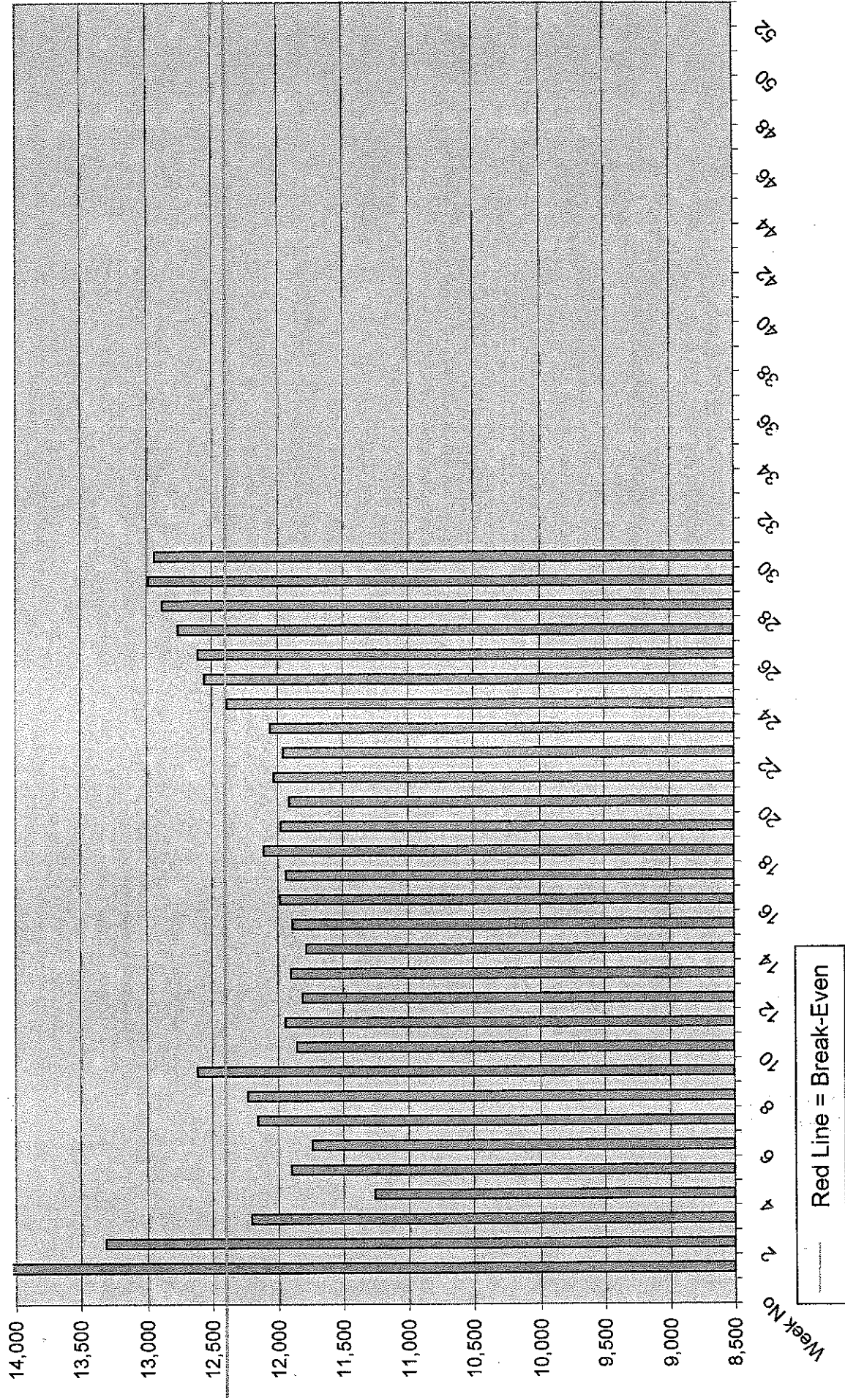

Bar & Catering Provision – Green Bank Leisure Centre

Proposed changes to Staff Catering arrangements at the Green Bank Leisure Centre

Written response from Unison to the extensive staff consultation that took place in Summer 2002

Dear Chris

Thank you for giving us the opportunity to comment on the proposals for the bar and catering provision at the Green Bank Leisure Centre. In principle Unison has no problems with the proposals to close the existing restaurant service indeed it would seem sound economic sense.

However on the detailed proposals SLM suggestions for a new “Nescafe to go “ snack bar and the revised opening hours of the bar must be made by them on the basis that they know their business. The enhancement of the trolley service including new heated trolley as welcome as this is still leaves us with a little concern , as you are aware the trolley service starts at around 10.00 a.m till approx Midday ,this is outside core lunchtimes and would not seem to be either acceptable to Employees or the Authority.

Consideration must also be considered that the closing of the canteen in the first place was due to providing a place at the Leisure Centre for employees to go. We would be looking for a place in the Civic Offices such as the Old Refectory suitably improved for employees to take their lunch breaks away from their desks.

SLM could possibly provide for example a jacket potato / pies /pasty service from 12.00 – 2.00 p.m. or if they are not prepared to consider this maybe the provision of microwaves/freezers / fridges could be an alternative.

In conclusion Unison would support the moves provided some consultation with the Authority and SLM could take place to meet our perceived requirements.
