SDP/35. MINUTES

The Minutes of the Meeting held on 17th January 2013 were taken as read, approved as a true record and signed by the Chairman.

SDP/36. **UPDATE ON THE WORK OF THE MAT TEAMS**

A presentation was delivered on the work of the MAT teams, who delivered a children, young people and family support service. Aims of the service were listed along with all of the support services offered. Activities included;

- Delivering activities in the community
- Providing a key worker to develop a positive plan.

 Introducing children and young people to positive activities to support their development.

The management structure was identified and detail was also provided on the Children's Centres that provided services for families with children during the early years to give children the best possible start in life. Activities were delivered in partnership with Midwives, Health Visitors, GPs, Nurseries, Schools, Adult Education and Job Centres.

Performance levels were detailed, and included, providing a response to 2000 requests for support and reducing anti-social behaviour.

Details were also provided on work that is carried out in conjunction with the Voluntary Sector.

SDP/37. YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT

A report was submitted that clarified the current youth unemployment situation in South Derbyshire, and sought to highlight concerns raised by the Sustainable Development Group regarding the future of careers advice.

Details were provided on the numbers of young people not in employment, education or training, and the current situation with regard to careers advice that was currently available.

It was reported that a range of activities were being undertaken by the Partnership and its Members, that would provide assistance to young people in South Derbyshire.

The Chairman reported that there may be some additional money available from Central Government to support young people looking for employment. Nick Freeman also confirmed that Toyota were keen to engage with Careers Advisors in schools.

SDP/38. SUSTAINABLE COMMUNITY STRATEGY MONITORING REPORT 2012/13

A presentation was delivered which reported details of performance for the year ending 31st March 2013, in relation to the Sustainable Community Strategy Action Plan.

- Communicating positive environmental messages in a unique way
- Raising awareness of the National Forest
- Attracting visitors to Swadlincote highlighting how the town has changed.
