Report of the Head of Environmental Health

1. PURPOSE

To consider the application for a premises licence at the The Thorntree, 59 Bretby Lane, Newhall, Swadlincote, Derbyshire, DE11 0LL. The approximate location of the premises is shown on the plan at **Appendix 1**.

2. BACKGROUND

- 2.1 An application has been received from John Gaunt & Partners Solicitors on 22nd August 2005 on behalf of Mr Lee Butler requesting a premises licence for the Thorntree Inn, 59 Bretby Lane, Newhall, Swadlincote, DE11 9DG. Although 'Grandparent Rights' are not a condition, DCMS (Department of Culture Media and Sport) suggest existing Licence conditions should be taken into account. The application is requesting:-

 To Permit the premises to open for licensable activities to show the broadcast of televised sporting events of national or international interest outside normal operating hours such opening times for this purpose to be confirmed upon 7 days prior notice in writing to the police before the premises intend to open, such notification to include the opening times and the sporting event which is to be shown.
 - 10. Hours Premises Open to the Public 11:00 01:30 Monday Thursday, 11:00 02:30 Friday & Saturday, 12:00 01:30 Sunday.

The premises will close 30 minutes after the end of the non-standard timings Identified above.
