

	Janice Pallett welcomed everyone to the meeting and introductions were made from the panel. Apologies were received from Mary Horne, Sheila Jackson and Tony Stone	
2	Minutes of last meeting (to be agreed) and update on actions	Action
	The minutes were agreed as a true record of the last meeting.	
3	Safer Neighbourhoods Sergeant's Overview / Priorities Update	Action
	<p>Sgt Summers introduced himself as the new Sgt for the area. Sgt Bromley attended the last meeting, but there will now be one SNT Sgt covering all 6 areas.</p> <p>Sgt Summers discussed crime statistics from 1st April to 31st August - year to date. Everything is up slightly on last year across the whole of Derbyshire but Area 6 has very low crime.</p> <p>Assault & violence x 27 – same as last year Robberies – none Sexual offences x 5 compared to 3 last year Dwelling burglaries x 5 compared to 3 last year Non dwelling burglaries are up to 16 from 14 last year Shoplifting x 2, same as last year Theft from person x 10, same as last year Theft of motor vehicles x 3 compared with 2 last year Theft from motor vehicles x 11 up from 3 last year, with 4 being thefts of number plates. These are happening across the district Bike thefts x 2 compared to 0 last year Damage x 28 crimes compared to 25 last year Overall 146 crimes compared to 115 last year</p> <p>ASB is down from 126 to 104, which equates to a reduction of 18%. Sgt Summers confirmed this was down to good policing. All crime figures are available on line and on the police website.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • PC Crerar discussed Operation Safedrive carried out recently with assistance from the Crest Team and VOSA, the following offences were committed: - • Seatbelts x 35; mobile phones x 10, licence offences x 1; trailer offences x 1; vehicle registration plates x 4. This proved to be a good day with people prosecuted for offences. A different area will be targeted next time. • PC Crerar re-visited Bridge Street, Castle Gresley, where there had previously been ASB issues. Two people were arrested for drugs and dealt with. No further reports of ASB from the area since. • PCSO McMillan confirmed that ASB had been low in Area 6. HGV checks have been carried out in Overseal and 4 tickets issued for contravening a 7.5 tonne weight limit. 	
4	Partnership Update / Funding / New project ideas	Action
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Phil advised the group about the Handy Van Scheme who address security issues for those who are vulnerable, i.e. fitting window locks etc. The Partnership fund this scheme. Thanks were issued to the Handy Van Scheme from the Linton Parish. Doorstep caller notices are available to put in front doors. Leaflets were also available for adult and children & young people domestic abuse services in South Derbyshire. • New tools and powers for ASB from 1st October will simplify the existing powers and make it easier to take out public space protection orders. South Derbyshire has only 3 live ASBO's and 6 ABC's currently. New software will be rolled out across the county to provide a multi-agency 	

	<p>approach to identify repeat ASB victims and make it easier and efficient to deal with ASB.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Prison me no way sessions in schools continue to be funded by the Partnership, which highlights consequences in crime using real life prison officers and current prisoners. • Hate crime awareness sessions will be held alongside the Shout Out group in South Derbyshire. • Number plate operations have been carried out across the district and will continue with anti-theft screws being installed into number plates. A local operation will be held at Toons and a date will be announced soon. • Operation Jacuzzi is ongoing - if police spot items of value left in cars, the owner gets sent a letter from the police pointing it out and asking them to be more careful in future. • One funding application has been received from Overseal Parish Council for the village hall who have had issues with vandalism. A CCTV system was installed a few years ago and equipment now needs upgrading. This application is for improvements to the system. Quotations have been received for £1,235 total project cost with £927 funding requested. There have been issues with cars late at night annoying residents. The application meets the Partnership criteria. This is the only application that has come in this year for Area 6. Match funding is available from the Parish Council. The Application was approved by the group. 	
5	Local Issues – open forum	
	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Cllr Murray questioned what operations has been planned prior to Halloween and Bonfire Night. Phil confirmed similar ops will be run to previous years. • Stuart Batchelor discussed a seminar on 12th November to highlight changes to ASB legislation, commencing at 6.30 pm at the Civic Offices. Invites will be going out to all Parish Councils. • Resident raised there was an unsecure field next to the recreation ground at Mount Pleasant Road. The gate was wide open, no post for it to shut to and the ownership unknown. Parish Council agreed to look at ownership. Stuart Batchelor also agreed to ask at SDDC if they can ID the land owner. • Resident raised that Derbyshire Carers, who are based at CVS offices are keen to assist and they give respite to those caring for others. • Jo Smith (CVS) discussed their upcoming AGM on 10th October and subsequent launch of a community forum. This will be held at Swadlincote Town Hall, commencing at 10 am and everyone is welcome. • Resident discussed the Linton no cold calling area and that signs have been put in most houses. There has been a spate of people coming round, knocking on doors and causing general nuisance. It was requested that the entire estate be made an official no cold calling zone as this causes distress. Phil Marriott discussed an official scheme run by DCC trading standards and also the unofficial zones, which exist. There are no laws to enforce people who cold call as this is not an offence. PC Crerer spoke to Nottingham Knockers selling tea towels etc. but the person stopped did have ID on them. • Nomination forms for Vice Chair were available at the back of the room. • Resident raised that 4 cars had been parked on the pavement on Main Street, Linton not leaving room for anyone to pass, opposite the Brick Room, Linton. • Racist graffiti had been found on changing rooms on Mount Pleasant Road. It was questioned whether it would be ok to install CCTV as it is close to a children's play area. PCSO McMillan took photos and Chris Smith at the Partnership was aware. LA/13 **APOLOGIES**

LA/15 **CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENTS**

Jo Smith (Director of CVS) announced in the previous meeting that the CVS AGM would take place on 10th October in Swadlincote Town Hall, commencing at 10 am. Everyone was welcome.

The planning appeal against the District Council's refusal of permission to Gladman developments starts next Tuesday (9th September) at 10 am at the Council Chambers, SDDC. Public are welcome but speakers must attend at 10 am to register.

LA/16 **MINUTES**

The Minutes of the Linton Area Forum held on 28th May 2014 were noted.

LA/17 **REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING**

The Chairman reviewed those items raised at the last Meeting and the Forum Liaison Officer reported the progress made in each case.

Acresford Road, Netherseal - Carriageway flooding

Forum Liaison Officer discussed the flooding at Acresford opposite the Crickets Inn. Drainage goes through an opposite field and outpours into a brook. It is believed that the pipework is damaged in the field and access is needed to carry out repairs. DCC have written to the landowner on a few occasions but have received no response. The field was waterlogged at the time of the last meeting and it was suggested that this was polluting the river Mease. This was discussed with the flood risk team but decided it was unlikely to cause concern with the Environment Agency. DCC can use Section 100 of the Highways Act to access the land. The landowner has been written to with notification of DCC's intentions to enter the land without permission at the end of the notice period to repair damage.

Director of Community and Planning updated the group on item 8. Kate Allies made investigations into Ernest Hall Way, which is not SDDC land and therefore not responsible for maintenance. This issue will be referred to the Planning Enforcement Officer to consider.

LA/18 **PUBLIC QUESTIONS ON ISSUES RAISED BY RESIDENTS**

It was raised that pot holes are still an issue around the Cadley Hill roundabout. The same holes are getting bigger and motorists need to swerve to avoid them coming from Toons.

ACTION- Forum Liaison Officer to report back to a future meeting.

It was raised that in the vicinity of Coton Park / Badgers Hollow Recreation Ground there were about 15 holes in the centre of the road getting worse. Opposite the Red Lion in Linton there were also a series of holes. The Highways Dept had telephoned resident to ask where the pot holes were that had damaged a car wheel. Two deep holes are on the Walton to Rosliston Road on the left hand side.

ACTION - Forum Liaison Officer to refer the matter back to DCC

Cllr Murray stated that the Government had allocated funding to address these potholes and asked what was the value of funding to address these issues.

ACTION - Forum Liaison Officer to obtain figures and report back to the next meeting

It was raised that vegetation is overgrown at the Rosliston / Drakelow (Flintmill) crossroads and makes it very difficult to see. Cllr Lauro stated that in order to make it safe it needs traffic lights. The vegetation has been looked at and reported. It was raised that two signs, when approaching from Caldwell Road, stand out from the hedge. The hedge needs cutting and the signs moving back to improve the vision.

Councillor Wheeler commented that new jet patching of small potholes was an improvement.

REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING

At the last Linton Area Forum held on 2nd September 2014 at Netherseal Village Hall, the following issues were raised and a progress report is provided.

Derbyshire County Council Issues:

1. Acresford Road, Carriageway flooding

Progress will be reported to the forum as and when available.

2. Cadley Hill roundabout, Castle Gresley – carriageway deterioration

It is anticipated that the majority of the money made available through the accelerated maintenance programme will be targeted at surface dressing (and pre-patching in readiness for this). Any location where resurfacing is needed would need to be considered as part of the named scheme process.
