Re: Proposed revision of opening hours at Repton British Legion.

I wish to object to the proposals to extend the opening hours until midnight.

When the British Legion is in use many of the patrons park on both sides of The Pastures, right up to the drive to my house, making it difficult to turn into, and more difficult to turn out of. Sometimes I have to park well beyond my drive, and move my car when the Legion has closed. If the opening hours are extended until midnight, it will be at least an hour after this when the parking clears. This is unacceptable.

I suggest that parking should be restricted to one side of The Pastures only, whether or not the opening hours are extended.

The noise of people leaving, doors slamming, cars revving, will continue beyond what is acceptable in a residential area.

Variation of Club Premises Certificate Application
Royal British Legion Club at 43 High St. Repton

I refer to the above application which has been locally advertised. As I live across the road from the Club, I wish to object to the proposed terms for the playing of music (live or recorded) until 1 am on three nights every week --on Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays --in addition to Bank Holidays and Christmas.

The Club is located in a primarily residential area and its immediate neighbours are all houses. I suggest that 1 am is too late for music which can be clearly heard at considerable volume by neighbours and also the power to hold such activity on more than 150 nights a year is unreasonable. I suggest that 12 midnight is quite late enough and that some limit should be put on the number of nights when music can be played after 11 pm-- that is a limit of substantially less than three nights per week throughout the year.

THIS AMOUNTS TO A POTENTIAL LOUD MUSIC EVENT ON UP TO 170 DAYS PER YEAR LASTING UNTIL 1AM.

THE CLUB IS SURROUNDED BY RESIDENTIAL PROPERTIES. THE BUILDING IS NOT DESIGNED TO CONTAIN SOUND AND MUSIC HAS IN THE PAST BEEN VERY AUDIBLE TO NEIGHBOURS. 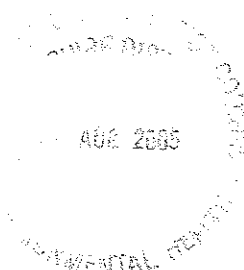

Ref : Planning Application : Repton British Legion Extending Hours of Licensing

I recently saw the application to extend the licensing hours of the Royal British Legion on High Street in Repton, unfortunately there was no associated reference number. I would like to raise an objection due to the following reasons :

- Our house is situated on The Pastures which is a two minute walk from these premises, in fact you can directly see it from our house. We are often disturbed by the noises coming from the club on evenings when events are taking place and at the weekends when they are very busy. If you extend the license and entertaining hours until the early hours of the morning this would prevent me from sleeping. Our bedroom window is on the front of our house and as a result we can hear the music, singing, loud speaker noises and even follow what is being said when the microphone is being used. I moved to Repton so I could be part of a quiet village community and it is fast becoming like an inner city residence.
- Parking on The Pastures / High Street is becoming a problem as many people are using this area for the local Indian Restaurant plus the Legion Club and Chinese Takeaway. If I have visitors it is becoming difficult for them to park. I also think that by approving this application, the parking situation will make traffic congestion worse and it would also cause noise problems when people walk up the road to drive home. I do not want this extra noise at 1pm in the morning as we need our sleep at weekends.

I urge you to reject this application as it will severely affect the residents quality of life in the surrounding area.

I hope you will take our views into consideration when reviewing this application
