Chris Smith highlighted that the report back in the Agenda Pack should be referred to.

2. Police Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) Report and Police Q&A

PC James Williams gave the following update: -

Since our last Area Forum meeting, we have been busy completing our Neighbourhood priorities, these were set historically by concerns raised at these forum meetings but are now decided using the following:

- Incidents reported
- Engagement/concerns raised in the community via our social media
- Discussions and meetings with partner agencies (Community Safety Partnership)
- Derbyshire Alert message replies
- Derbyshire Talking surveys in the community

From the above, the Neighbourhood priorities were and remain for this quare: -

1. Speeding
2. Anti-Social Behaviour in open spaces (parks etc.)
3. Anti-Social Behaviour in Swadlincote Town Centre
4. School parking

If you are not already receiving Derbyshire Alert messages, please sign up via www.derbyshirealert.co.uk and complete the Derbyshire Talking surveys so we can see what matters to you.

There are now various ways to report incidents to the Police, you can Call 101, Direct Message @derpol on Twitter, Direct Message Derbyshire Constabulary on Facebook and via the website - www.derbyshire.police.uk.

In terms of good results in your local area, there have been many school, preschool and youth group talks completed highlighting topics such as road safety, anti-social behaviour (ASB), hate crime, knife crime, stranger danger and how the Police can help.



School patrols are completed around the area by the SNT daily, working on a rotation basis around the schools.

There have been events conducted throughout the local area and engagement with the community to raise awareness of crime prevention. There has also been a Blue Light Breakfast engagement event at Netherhall Care home which local PC's and PCSO's have attended.

Targeted patrols have been completed alongside the Rural Crime Team throughout the rural locations of the area.

Numerous vehicles have been seized for having no insurance and/or no licence throughout the area, specifically on Cadley Lane, High Cross in Overseal and Bob Southern Grove.

Several drivers have been arrested for driving over the alcohol limit and failing drug swipes.

We have been dealing proactively with E-Scooters where they have been found.

A traffic operation carried out, resulted in several drivers being reported for speeding in the area.

We helped out the Road Traffic Police with Drink Drive checks as part of the Christmas campaign.

A stolen car has been located and seized on Coronation Street, Overseal.

Knife sweeps have been carried out as part of Operation Sceptre (a national week of action in order to help tackle knife crime) in Coton-in-the-Elms and Overseal whereby no knives were found.

Derbyshire Talking surveys have been completed with residents in Drakelow.

Swadlincote SNT joined our neighbouring SNT from Leicester and completed a Heavy Goods Vehicle Operation near Albert Village, many vehicles were stopped and checked.

A *Slow down/Pass wide near horses'* campaign has been taking place.

For your area, your local SNT Officers are PC Joanna Saddington and PCSO Andrea Thompson.

Councillor Paul Marbrow asked if the local PCSO's and PC's could call in and chat to people whilst patrolling rural area's as they may be able to direct Police to problem areas.

PC James Williams will feedback to PCSO Andrea Thompson and encourage people to make contact through the Police SNT Facebook page if not comfortable in ringing 101.

Inspector Mike Sisman explained that engagement is key to the local SNT.

Inspector Mike Sisman explained, he has now boosted the staffing to seven in the SNT across the whole of South Derbyshire. The Inspector further explained his priority is to fully staff the



24/7 response team across South Derbyshire. With a lot of the PCSO's now recruited into the Police, there is now a strive for recruitment of new PCSO's which will hopefully be complete Autumn time whereby staffing will be back to full capacity.

Councillor Wheelton expressed that the Parish Councils would be happier, with a clearer picture if crime figures were available to them.

In terms of the crime rates, Inspector Sisman informed Overseal is the lowest Crime rate of area six, with the biggest area of concern being domestic abuse.

Inspector Sisman asked Debbie Punter to collate emails together and will go back and speak with PCSO Andrea Thompson to see if a monthly email can be sent with the crime figures on.

ACTION: Debbie Punter to collate Councillor Wheelton's email with PCSO Andrea Thomson and Inspector Mike Sisman for crime figure purposes.

Councillor Wheelton asked Inspector Sisman to explain the work going on at 101.

Inspector Sisman informed that within the Police, a team has been set up in the control room to free up the 101 service. Currently in infancy, a better response from 101 in the near future is highly likely. The new team will take a call and deal with it at source, freeing other officers time for incidents on the streets.

Councillor Wheelton asked for an action for Inspector Mike Sisman to feedback to the Rural Crime Team that they need Southern Officers in this area.

ACTION: Inspector Mike Sisman to feedback to the Rural Crime Team that Southern Offices are needed in the area.

Inspector Mike Sisman explained over time, money has been invested from South Derbyshire to support the Rural Crime Team. Soon, staff from South Derbyshire will be working with the Rural Crime Team to provide that visibility which will upskill staff in the long run too.

Overseal Parish Council Clerk asked, from a Parish Council perspective when alerts are received, is there any way additional information can be accessed.

Inspector Mike Sisman is happy to try and improve this and will pass on email to PCSO Andrea Thompson.

ACTION: Inspector Mike Sisman to pass on Vicky Roe's email to PCSO Andrea Thompson.

Vicky Roe asked if there is a way the village know when a PCSO or PC is in the area.

Inspector Mike Sisman explained that it is difficult to do so as both a PC or PCSO can be taken away on a call at any one time.



Inspector Sisman thanked all for their help in all they do to help the Police force and that is shown through the crime figures. Additionally, Inspector Sisman thanked Chris Smith and his team for all they do.

3. South Derbyshire Community Safety Partnership/ Safer Neighbourhood Grants Update

Chris Smith, Communities Team Manager, gave the following update: -

ASB Warning Letters

In terms of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Claire Rawlins, our ASB Officer has been working closely with Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) issuing warning letters to young people who are causing ASB in the area. A couple of youth related issues have been dealt with in this area, young people causing issues in the town centre. A separate group throwing eggs onto the A50 – both groups have been identified with Claire and the Police issuing warnings and parents have been visited. Since this, no members of the group have raised their heads.

Police Community Engagement Events

Debbie Punter, our Community Safety Officer has been supporting the police with the community Engagement events around the District, as has Mark from the Safer Homes Scheme picking up referrals and offering people security advice. Offering residents with Community Safety Advice and dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour complaints at such events.

New Communities Team Service Assistant

Following interviews held earlier this month the Communities Team has appointed Rosie Collins to the role of Service Assistant. Rosie previously worked as a Sports Casual for several years and will join the team on 5 April, taking over from Debbie who has moved into a new role as Community Safety Officer.

New Partnership Vehicles

Two new vehicles which are being supplied by Toyota for use by our local Safer Neighbourhood Team. The vehicles which should arrive in the next few weeks will replace the existing two old vehicles and will be maintained by the District Council.

School Banners

Going forward, we will be purchasing some banners for the SNT to give out to local primary schools to remind parents to park considerately at drop off and pick up times.

Safer Neighbourhoods and Community Funding

There has been no new applications received since the last meeting and there is now money available for next financial year. If there are any ideas for new projects which could



impact on ASB, community engagement or Crime and Disorder, please do not hesitate to contact Chris or Debbie.

Councillor Bridgen asked, if anything can be done locally from a Police perspective at crossroad from Rosliston to Burton and Swadlincote to Drakelow, with the highest occurrence of accidents in the whole of Derbyshire.

Inspector Sisman will speak with Chris Smith and speak with the Collision Investigation Team to see if there is anything that can be done.

ACTION: Inspector Sisman to take away concerns regarding the crossroads from, Rosliston to Burton and Swadlincote to Drakelow to the Collision Investigation Team.

4. Local Community and Voluntary Sector Projects/ Update

Karen Bradford provided the following service update: -

Active Travel

This service supports people who have no transport and are unable to use public transport to take them to medical appointments - GP, Hospital, Vaccinations. The service is still limited as we do not have too many drivers active and we are being careful about the number of passenger journeys drivers undertake per day. We are only doing Hospital and GP appointments at the moment as we have to prioritise the journeys for health appointments. Drivers and Service Users are expected to still wear masks, socially distance and use hand sanitiser to keep everybody safe. We will not transport anyone with any symptoms of Covid 19 and our drivers will not drive if they have any symptoms.

Befriending

Since March 2020 our Befriending Service has been carried out through telephone calls. Some face-to-face visits have started but this is dependent on many factors the befriender, the volunteer and some processes. We have to check that this is safe for both parties and carry out new risk assessments. Some volunteers, who started volunteering in the last year telephone befriending, also need to go through extra checks and training before being able to start face to face visits. This takes time and we again need to do this before permitting people to start visiting in person. Please bear with us while we do this.

Home From Hospital



This scheme has been continuing to support people throughout the pandemic. We are beginning to plan to introduce home visits again, but we will be doing so with caution and with procedures in place to keep everyone involved safe.

Safer Homes

This service has been open again since April last year and visits were resumed to ensure people's homes are safe and secure and advise them on measures to improve security and to install locks etc to help this. Our operative continues to wear PPE, maintains social distance and follows safety measures and cleaning procedures before, during and after his visits. Food Bank

Our Food Bank is now operating from Hill St Baptist Church in Swadlincote and collection of food parcels is by appointment only on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 8am - 3:30pm. Please telephone 07458 305314 (**please note this number is for food bank enquiries only**, for general CVS enquiries call 01283 219761) or email projectsupport@sdcv.org.uk to arrange an appointment. If emailing, please include your telephone number with your message so we can get back to you as soon as possible.

The service provides free emergency food parcels to families and individuals in the South Derbyshire area. We also have a fridge and freezer so are also able to support service users with fresh food donated by local businesses.

Anyone who needs emergency food can access the service. On the first occasion that you need a parcel, you can refer yourself to the service. For each food parcel after that, you will need to provide a referral form before you will be given a parcel.

Covid Connectors Project – to set up a Covid Connectors Network throughout South Derbyshire



This is used to empower residents and workforces in South Derbyshire with the information they need to lead the way in the community by giving consistent, timely and accurate information around Covid-19. Since January 2021 the team have been working with 32 Covid Connectors. Through these networks, covid related information has been shared with the Connectors who then disseminate the information to their local communities. The funding has now been extended until December 2022 and will be focusing more on health and wellbeing and moving into recovery from the pandemic. For more information contact Selinaw@sdcvs.org.uk

5. Local Authority Update and Public Q&A

Allison Thomas, Strategic Director of Service Delivery, provided the following update: -

Bikeability

The Councils Active Health and Wellbeing Team have secured funding to continue delivering Bikeability sessions to local primary schools for the next financial year, this is thanks to their hard work, dedication and ability to deliver and exceed targets over a number of years.

The Bikeability sessions are a modern version of the old Cycle proficiency whereby young children are taught how to ride bikes safely on the roads but also helps them to gain independence, social skills and a sense of wellbeing.

After Bikeability, children are better at responding to risk and report increased confidence.

As a result, more children cycle to school which in turn improves mental health and wellbeing.

High visibility items provided by the Community Safety Partnership are also provided to each child who attends the course.

Health and Wellbeing

A new Health and Wellbeing section has been developed on the Council's website, [Health and wellbeing | South Derbyshire District Council](http://www.southderbyshire.gov.uk/health-and-wellbeing).

The website is based around the 'Five Ways to Wellbeing' and contains information and support on physical and mental wellbeing.

Airport Environmental Awards Scheme

Our Environmental Education Team based at Rosliston Forestry Centre, are getting involved in the Airport's Community Fund. They have launched an initiative in local schools across South Derbyshire, for the schools to design an eco-garden. With this, the schools with the best designs will be granted a sum of money, up to £20,000 in order to make their designs a reality.

ISO14001 Recertification

Following an extensive eight-day external audit of the Council's ISO14001 Environmental Management System, the Council has been awarded re-certification to the international standard for the 12th time.

The audit required the Leadership Team and all services across the authority to provide evidence that the principles and practices of high-quality environmental management were embedded in everything the Council does.

The audit found the Council had made significant advances in its environmental management practices over the last two years with only a few areas highlighted for improvement.

Apprenticeship Update

The Council has employed six apprentices with a seventh currently going through the recruitment process to join as a Business Administration Apprentice in Housing.

The apprenticeship scheme has given the individuals involved the opportunity to gain real work experience and support whilst completing their respective qualification.

The feedback received from both our apprentices and those mentoring or managing them has been extremely positive.

Our goal is to create more apprenticeship opportunities in the coming months.

REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING

At the last Linton Community Meeting held on Thursday, March 31, 2022 via Microsoft Teams, the following issues were raised, and a progress report is provided.

Emailing of Crime Figures

Councillor Wheelton expressed that the Parish Councils would be happier, with a clearer picture if crime figures were available to them.

In terms of the crime rates, Inspector Sisman informed Overseal is the lowest Crime rate of area six, with the biggest area of concern being domestic abuse.

Inspector Sisman asked Debbie Punter to collate emails together and will go back and speak with PCSO Andrea Thomson to see if a monthly email can be sent with the crime figures on.

ACTION: Debbie Punter to collate Councillor Wheelton's email with PCSO Andrea Thomson and Inspector Mike Sisman for crime figure purposes.

21.06.22 PCSO Andrea Thomson updated: "I have a list of eight different areas in Area 6, and this list mainly consists of the Parish Clerks and Councillor Wheelton. Local Parish Councillors arranged a meeting around Netherseal Village Hall asking for advice on a couple of issues. I attended and it was very useful for me. I collate information from our system – started April 2022 – and work through the crime reports, sorting which area it belongs to and work from there. Unfortunately, I have no time to update news on these individual areas as it is very time consuming, but crime reports are interesting I think."

Rural Crime Team

Councillor Wheelton asked for an action for Inspector Mike Sisman to feedback to the Rural Crime Team that they need Southern Officers in this area.

ACTION: Inspector Mike Sisman to feedback to the Rural Crime Team that Southern Offices are needed in the area.

14.06.22 Inspector Sisman updated: "We have fed this back to the Rural Crime Team and locally we are getting two officers trained in Rural Crime Matters. The Rural Crime Team have been in the area working with SNT and LPU officers."

Inspector Sisman will speak with Chris Smith and speak with the Collision Investigation Team to see if there is anything that can be done.
