In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.



		It is the belief of the Chief Officer of Police that allowing the extension of the hours for consumption of alcohol in the rear garden of the premises and for the same at the front of the premises would have at adverse impact on two of the licensing objectives these being the Prevention of Public Nuisance and Public Safety	
		Condition 25 on the current licence was specifically added to help prevent and control noise and antisocial behaviour affecting the neighbours who adjoin the beer garden at the rear of the premises. This was added following many reports from neighbours complaining about noise and antisocial behaviour.	
	;	This condition was upheld by the Sub Licensing Committee who sat in hearing, when the request was put forwards previously.	
		"The rear beer garden (cross-hatched on the attached plans shall be closed at 10pm, except for smoking, and no drinks	

		or food shall be consumed outside after this time. Notices shall be displayed to that effect in that area. The area to the front of the premises facing Derby Road, and the area between the premises and 48 Derby Road (stripped on the attached plans) shall be closed at 8pm, and no drinks shall be consumed in this area after this time. This area shall not be opened until 8am the following day."
		In respect to the front of the property being used for the consumption of alcohol until 2300hrs, I would suggest that the space is too small and there are no barriers between the consumption area and the highway, therefore making it a risk for drinkers who potentially by this time will have consumed more alcohol than they would at the previous cut off time of 2000hrs. I believe extending the time to 2300hrs would breach the public safety objective. Please take this as formal notification of a representation from the Chief Officer of Police for Derbyshire Constabulary, made under Section 18(3) of the Licensing Act 2003.

Please use separate sheets if necessary The Amalfi White Bar and Restaurant is an on-licensed premises situated within the heart of Melbourne and is bordered by residential dwellings. It has a very small frontage area which has no clearly defined boundary between the frontage and the pavement of Derby Road other than the change in surface ie. No bordering wall. The large rear garden area of the premises can only be accessed from the premises itself. The request by the applicants to remove the current condition, number 25, to enable the premises to utilise the rear garden area and the front area of the premises for the consumption of alcohol until 2300hrs gives cause for concern that the four licensing objectives would be undermined. As stated, the area to the front is a small area with no clear defined barrier between the premises frontage and the highway. Derby Road is a busy highway for both vehicular and pedestrian traffic. Humans by nature are a social interacting species and coupled with the consumption of alcohol their inhibitions are further reduced. Therefore, the probability of members of the public and local residents going about their daily business and patrons of the premises socialising in such a small space and coming into contact is highly probable. An increase in the hours from 8pm to 11pm to enable further consumption of alcohol whilst utilising this small compact area has a high probability factor for confrontation between parties and an increase in noise from those socialising within this area and therefore, I submit it would have an adverse impact on and undermine all four of the licensing objectives.
		As stated, the rear garden area of the premises is a large extensive area that is bordered by residential dwellings.

		The premises is a popular destination venue for members of the public to visit and socialise. However, the close proximity of the residential dwellings and the patrons behaviour utilising the rear garden area has led to previous complaints and allegations received by this Authority with regards to noise, anti-social behaviour and breaches of the condition of the use of the rear garden area beyond its 10pm cut off for the consumption of alcohol. This has culminated in meetings with the current owners and management at the time of the reports and associated investigations with a view to addressing these issues and concerns whilst ensuring compliance with the imposed condition.
		I believe the owners/management have not introduced and demonstrated robust control measures to ensure compliance with this current condition. By increasing the opportunity of the use of this rear garden area for a further hour until 11pm including the consumption of alcohol by patrons would I believe bring with it extra demands upon the staff in managing and complying with the condition therefore undermining and having an adverse impact on the prevention of crime and disorder and the public safety licensing objectives. Therefore, to extend the current condition to enable patrons to utilise this garden area for an extra hour including the consumption of alcohol and food I believe would also have an adverse impact for the neighbouring dwellings residents with regards to the prevention of public nuisance and the protection of children from harm (Disturbance of sleep, etc).
		The current condition, that is being applied to be removed, was the subject of a previous application submitted to the licensing and appeals sub-committee by the current premises licence holders. The committee on that occasion resolved that the condition should remain without amendment.

l am writing to register my objection to the application for extension of hours in the outside garden from 10pm to 11pm.

The noise and disruption from customers as alcohol consumption increases and they gather outside in large groups well past the 2200 cut off time with very loud sometimes very offensive language, yelling at each other etc. I think it would be best if Amalfie White would show some regard to their neighbours by keeping to the garden closing time at present before they are able to extend it. Who supervises these customers outside? Could they not ask them to keep their voices down as we can't enjoy our gardens as we should be able to.

We are writing to put our objections to the proposed extension of opening hours to the outside areas of the Amalfi White Bar & Restaurant.

The rear patio and garden borders 6 neighbours directly and several more within a few metres, all of whom are impacted by noise whenever the rear area is in use. Most of these neighbours will be unaware of the application as it is not publicised.

Our house is adjacent to the patio area and so is less than a couple of metres from where scores of guests congregate, currently for up to 10 hours a day. Our garden is also adjacent to the Amalfi garden. Our peaceful amenity is regularly disturbed, particularly on Fridays, Saturdays & Sundays. This is made significantly worse when Amalfi flout their current Licence conditions and allow people to stay outside drinking after 10pm. We have had to make formal complaints to SDDC Licensing, which we hope will be taken into consideration in determining the application. We work shifts, as well as on-call for the NHS, and on many evenings we are trying to sleep when there are rowdy guests in Amalfi's garden. Extending the opening hours will make this significantly worse for us.

We have children, as will some of the other neighbours, who are affected by the noise and also by nuisance light from lights being left on at Amalfi continuously and overnight on regular occasions — this despite numerous requests to ensure all lights are switched off. This is now made worse by new garden lights that stay on until midnight and encroach into bedrooms at the other end of our house.

Amalfi's indoor opening hours were extended only a couple of years ago and allow opening until 1am/1.30am, with options to open even later on nominated occasions. This gives substantial opportunity to provide their service and be a successful business, whilst already impacting on many neighbours in close proximity.

We therefore request that this application is rejected.
