Dear, Madam,

I am writing to inform you, that unfortunately, I do not think that I will be able to attend the Licensing Committee Hearing on the 21/3/2011 in respect to the Rosliston Village Hall, license application, due to work commitments.

However, I respectfully request that on my behalf, you submit the following representation to the committee for their consideration.

As stated in my objection, dated 19/1/2011, the reasons were mainly anti social behaviour sometimes occurring. Examples of this are as follows.

- · Shouting & Swearing in the car park as well as the street.
- Drinking in the car park.
- Car horns being sounded as users leave the hall.
- Children playing in the car park & playground late at night.
- Overflow from the car park affecting traffic using the street.
- Car headlamps shining into adjacent properties bedroom windows.
- Noise from music events.

In Mr. Matkins letter dated 27/1/2011, he states he is unaware of any problems relating to antisocial behaviour, which is probably true, due to the fact that he is not a resident of the village. However, most residents would not have been aware of who to contact anyway and would have been reluctant to waste police time on such matters.

Some of the examples stated have been relayed to me, from residents who were not given the opportunity to object, as they never received notification from the Village Hall Committee. In fact I am only aware of four properties being notified but I'm prepared to be corrected if wrong.

I would assume that one of those notified is a lady who lives at 44 Main street, who is very seriously ill and could not be expected to object. Another lady who lives at 43 Main Street, who is 84 years old, has told me of her concerns and another resident in Yew Tree Road who raised the concern over the play area, stated they did not receive notification.

Please note, that there are no objections to the hall being used, but issues need to be addressed by the Village Hall Committee and properly controlled by premises supervisor, with respect to the 2003 Licensing Act, Sections 101, 140, 177.

Also not forgetting, 'Overflow from the car park' is a concern, as the Village Hall Occupancy is regulated at 220 persons, which is a lot of cars in a residential street.

In conclusion, I would like to thank the Licensing Committee for hearing my representation and hope that if any conditions are attached to the application, that the premises supervisors follow the legislation of the Licensing Act, with the welfare of the local residents being shown due consideration.
