

	Councillor Kim Coe updated that the South Derbyshire Safer Neighbourhood Policing Team had won team of the year in the county for the work they had done in the district.	
2	Minutes of the last meeting (to be agreed) and update on actions.	
	The minutes were agreed as a true and accurate record. Chris Smith updated that Salt's in Swadlincote had been visited by the partnership but no further action was needed on a rough sleeper who had been witnessed on scaffolding outside the shop.	
3	Safer Neighbourhoods Sergeant's Overview / Priorities Update	
	PCSO Claire Statham reported that:	
	 There had been a decline in calls for service in Area 4. Those which had come in had been dealt with by way of Community Protection Notice Warnings (CPNw) and Community Protection Notices (CPN). Six successful house search warrants had been executed. 	
	 Seven cars had been taken off the road for a variety of motor offences. Regarding street drinkers, one was now on a CPN and once step away from a Criminal Behaviour Order (CBO – new name for an ASBO). 	
	• A mobile phone operation had been carried out on the border of Area 4 and Area 6 (Linton area). Offences committed were using a mobile phone and not wearing a seatbelt, earning those responsible six penalty point and a £200 fine.	
	A community speed watch group had been set up in Church Gresley, with six volunteers trained. Two successful operations had been carried out and 14	
	 advisory letters sent out. The SNT officers would be at Sainsbury's in Swadlincote on October 18 between

9am and 11am for a 'coffee with a copper event' for local people to meet the team.

PC Stuart Kelly reported that the area had been hit hard in the previous two weeks with a series of house burglaries in the town centre and in areas bordering Area 4 and Area 5 (Midway, Newhall and Stanton). The offences were committed during the night and in the early morning when the perpetrator walked into properties and stealing from within. Teams of PCs and PCSOs were sent out between 3am and 5.30am. Excellent CCTV footage was obtained from a burglary of the Stanhope Arms on September 27 and the burglary was reported while it took place. The perpetrator was identified from the footage and he had two escape routes – unfortunately, police went to the wrong one. The following day he again thwarted officers. On the third day, the offender stole a car and was later found hiding. He escaped through a window and bounced off a conservatory roof before running across fields. The police helicopter was called in but the offender somehow hid from the infrared camera. He was cornered and threatened an officer before being gassed and taken into custody. Sgt Summer confirmed that it was a resource intensive operation to catch an offender who was going to continue burgling until he was caught. Without the dedication of officers he would've continued to offend. Inspector Kate Bateman added that the impact of such an offender couldn't be underestimated.

Sgt Summers introduced PCSO Ed Johnson to the meeting.

4 Partnership Update / Funding / New Project Ideas

Mr Smith updated the meeting on Operation Zao, an anti-knife crime drive from Derbyshire Police. A summit had taken place at the Pirelli Stadium. Speakers with experience of knife crime made it a powerful and emotional event which would hopefully discourage any youngsters from carrying a knife. Among the speakers was a police inspector who lost his brother. He was stabbed for 63p. Mr Smith said the content made him glad that South Derbyshire didn't have the same problem as big cities.

Mr Smith confirmed that some of the CCTV cameras in Swadlincote were no longer working. The system was nearly nine years old and had been superb but now needed replacing. He was currently getting quotes for a new system and the technology available was much improved.

The Derbyshire Police and Crime Commissioner had launched his community action grant scheme. Large and small grants were available from the two-part initiative.

A Neighbourhood Watch co-ordinators' meeting was taking place on November 21 at Sharpe's Pottery.

Anti-trick or treat fliers for people to put in their windows were available at the rear of the meeting.

A street drinker in Swadlincote had breached his CPN and a CBO file was being put together.

Funding totalling £4,000 was available for Area 4. Councillor Coe reported that £500 had been awarded to the Goseley Activity Project. Youngsters had decided to make a film about ASB using the money. Mr Smith reported that Sharpe's Pottery had applied for a £2,000 contribution towards upgrading its CCTV system. There were 12 new cameras, including two external ones. It would leave £1,500 for other projects in 2017-18.

5 Local Issues – open forum (20 minutes)

A resident complained about Thorn Street, Woodville, being used as a cut-through to

avoid traffic lights elsewhere. At the bottom, where it joins South Street, there was a **ACTION:** give way sign and broken lines to give way but those using the rat run weren't giving Councillor way. Also in Thorn Street the double yellow lines had been shortened and parked traffic Garv were causing issues with the amount of traffic accessing Sun Street. Councillor Garv Musson to Musson had raised an enquiry with Derbyshire County Council regarding the double report back vellow lines to see why they'd been burned off. Depending on the response, he would on vellow be asking to have them reinstated. He would feed back at the next meeting. lines A resident reported that a wall had fallen down at the bottom of Coppice Side. It was **ACTION:** part of the Pipeworks site. Councillor Coe said she thought it was part of the site run by Chris a management company. Mr Smith said he would report it to SDDC's Health and Safety Smith to Officer. A member of the public added that children had also broken a fence down in report the area and it allowed them access to a 12ft drop. Sgt Summers said he would get his issue officers to have a look at the area. Councillor Stuart Swann reported that members of Castleton Park Neighbourhood Watch were receiving regular complaints about people parking around junctions on the estate. The problem was worst in Bexley Drive, Edinburgh Way, Hope Way and Westminster Drive. PCSO Statham was monitoring the problem but residents wanted drivers ticketing. PC Kelly said action was being taken. When he got out at the location, one of the drivers turned up so PC Kelly gave some advice. Councillor Swann suspected it was residents or their guests who were causing the problem. PC Kelly asked for photographs of the offending cars. A resident reported a van parked in York Road opposite Harrisons Van Sales. It was parked there all day, every day, obscuring the vision of drivers emerging from Market Street. PC Kelly said he had spoken to Harrisons Vans. Dennis Bateman added that he was investigating Harrisons and residents should be patient for an outcome. A member of the public complained about ASB on Woodville Rec, with groups of 30 youths congregating. Councillor Coe said that PCSO Dean Badham-Spalding was aware of the problem. A resident added that PCSO Badham-Spalding was a hero. ACTION: A resident complained that since the doctor's surgery and chemist moved in Woodville, there were parking issues on the pavement outside - even though there was a car Councillor park. Another resident said it was a case of better publicising the available car park. Sqt **Gary Musson** to raise sign Summers agreed and Councillor Musson said he would raise the issue of a sign with with DCC DCC. Councillor Musson mentioned drivers using Belvedere Road, Woodville, as a cut-ACTION: Sqt through to Moira Road. The road was access only. Sgt Summers said that police would Graham Summers to monitor the situation. send officers to Belvedere Road **Agreed Priorities** Sqt Summers said there weren't any emerging priorities. SA/13 **Chairman's announcements**

Councillor Mrs Kim Coe mentioned that Swadlincote's Safer Neighbourhood Police Team had been named Derbyshire SNT of the Year.

Councillor Ray Tipping was introduced to the meeting as the new representative for Woodville.

A resident stated how disappointed they were at the lack of councillors present at the meeting. Councillor Mrs Coe replied that Councillor Mrs Linda Chilton was unwell and Councillor Steve Taylor was on holiday.

SA/14 The minutes of the meeting held on June 13, 2017

The minutes were approved as a true and correct record.

SA/15 Report back on issues raised at the last meeting

HGV signage in Coppice Side

Frank McArdle reported that he had asked for a trial for all delivery drivers on site to resend directions to all delivery drivers in an effort to get them to use the correct route into the shopping centre. The trial ended on October 21 and then the affected residents would then be asked if they d noticed an improvement. A resident said they had not noticed a difference – there were no delivery signs at all. Mr McArdle said he would investigate the possibility of installing better signage. Councillor Stuart Swann asked if it was worth speaking to companies at a high level. Mr McArdle agreed that it could be an approach.

Bollards in High Street, Swadlincote

A resident reported that a secure van had come the wrong way up High Street the previous week. The bollard had not been lifted. Mr McArdle said he would find out who was responsible for it.

ACTION: Frank McArdle to report back on bollard responsibility

SA/16 Public questions on issues raised by residents

Regarding an issue at a previous meeting, a resident stated that they had a photo of a defunct footpath sign in Coppice Side which needed removing. Mr McArdle asked to see them after the meeting.

A resident of South Street, Woodville, said they felt abandoned by SDDC and DCC over a piece of highway outside their property which was unadopted. Thorn Street residents used the piece of highway every day to access car parking but it wasn't surfaced and cut up as well as producing dust. The resident has asked those using the road for £50 towards some

tarmac to surface it but they didn't respond. Mr McArdle replied that the resident had not been abandoned but SDDC had no rights or liabilities related to the piece of highway. He sympathised with the resident, but was powerless to do anything about the situation. Councillor Gary Musson added that he was getting up to speed with the issue and would explore any possible avenues with DCC. A resident said a solution would be to move some bollards and prevent access. Councillor Musson replied that moving them would cost in the region of £3,000 and a new Traffic Order would be needed.

A resident raised the issue of a bund outside the former Snooty Fox pub, in Hartshorne. A year earlier they had suggested something more permanent to protect the site was needed. Mr McArdle replied that a planning application for the site was imminent.

A member of the public asked what the situation was regarding the unfinished Diana Memorial Garden in Swadlincote. They also asked why the works were being carried out by a company from Melton Mowbray and not a local firm. Mr McArdle replied that there was a delay in supply of granite for the works and that best value dictated selection of contractor, regardless of their location. A resident added that it was a strange development at a time of cutbacks in the county.

A resident asked if any plans were in place to install charging points for electric cars since the Government was banning the sale of conventional ears from 2040. Mr McArdle replied that he didn't think Government had yet made detailed plans regarding the edict.

Councillor Musson said that parking was an ongoing problem that was going to get worse over time. Mr McArdle suggested he speak to Mike Roylance in SDDC's Economic Development department.

A member of the public asked what the situation was regarding the Woodville Regeneration Route. Mr McArdle replied that a meeting was taking place the next day regarding the initiative.

SA/17 County council issues

None.

SA/18 District council issues

Mr McArdle reported that SDDC was looking forward to the International Food Market in Swadlincote at the weekend. It was a brilliant event for the town. Small businesses continued to grow in the area and there was a lot going on in Swadlincote. SDDC's Economic Development team continued to look at new ideas and the Makers' Market came out of the food market.

Councillor Mrs Coe updated that the first South Derbyshire Community Awards would take place on October 13. A lot of businesses in South Derbyshire, including Toyota, had provided sponsorship.

A resident thanked SDDC for keeping parking free in South Derbyshire.

Councillor Mrs Coe said that more interesting shops were coming into Swadlincote. Mr McArdle added that the Economic Development team should be congratulated.

A member of the public raised the issue of the paving degrading on the Delph. Mr McArdle replied that there was spare York Stone to carry out repairs.

A resident asked if there was any movement on Gresley FC relocating to a new ground. Mr McArdle replied that the club was a private company. The local authority had done everything possible to provide options for the club.

REPORT BACK ON ISSUES RAISED AT THE LAST MEETING

At the last Swadlincote Area Forum, held on October 4, 2017, at Swadlincote Town Hall, the following issue was raised and a progress report is provided.

South Derbyshire District Council issues:

1. Bollard in High Street, Swadlincote

A resident reported that a secure van had come the wrong way up High Street the previous week. The bollard had not been lifted. Mr McArdle said he would find out who was responsible for it.

ACTION: Frank McArdle to report back on bollard responsibility

Update from SDDC's Direct Services department to be provided at the meeting.

MISSING REPORT BACK FROM THE LAST MEETING

1. Broken bollard in Thorn Street, Woodville

A member of the public reported that a bollard in Thorn Street, Woodville – off High Street – had been broken and left lying on a verge since 2016. It wanted removing or reinstalling.

The location following your submission was passed to an Highways Inspector on August 31, 2017, the damaged bollard was removed and our Highway Maintenance department has taken the decision to monitor the location to assess whether a future demand requires a replacement bollard to be installed.
