2. Police Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) Report and Police Q&A

PCSO Marley gave the following update: -

Since our last Area Forum meeting, we have been busy completing our Neighbourhood priorities, these were set historically by concerns raised at these forum meetings but are now decided using the following:

- Incidents reported
- Engagement/concerns raised in the community via our social media
- Discussions and meetings with partner agencies (Community Safety Partnership)
- Derbyshire Alert message replies
- Derbyshire Talking surveys in the community

From the above, the Neighbourhood priorities were and remain for this quatre: -

- 1. Speeding
- 2. Anti-Social Behaviour in open spaces (parks etc.)
- 3. Anti-Social Behaviour in Swadlincote Town Centre
- 4. School parking

If you are not already receiving Derbyshire Alert messages, please sign up via <u>www.derbyshirealert.co.uk</u> and complete the Derbyshire Talking surveys so we can see what matters to you.

There are now various ways to report incidents to the Police, you can Call 101, Direct Message **@derpol** on Twitter, Direct Message Derbyshire Constabulary on Facebook and via the website - <u>www.derbyshire.police.uk</u>.

In terms of good results in your local area, there have been many school, preschool and youth group talks completed highlighting topics such as road safety, anti-social behaviour (ASB), hate crime, knife crime, stranger danger and how the Police can help.

Extensive foot and vehicles patrols have been carried out in the area.

School patrols are completed around the area by the SNT daily, working on a rotation basis around the schools.



There have been many school, preschool and youth group talks completed highlighting topics such as road safety, anti-social behaviour (ASB), hate crime, knife crime and how the Police can help. Visiting Repton School, Repton Primary School, Newton Solney Infant School, Repton Proprietary, St. Wystans, Willington Primary, Stenson Primary, Findern Primary, Littleover Primary, Smisby Nursery, Bladen House and Dame Catherine in Ticknall.

There have been events conducted throughout the local area and engagement with the community to raise awareness of crime prevention. Over 500 local residents visited a local event in Repton along with Swadlincote Fire Service and other agencies we work closely with. Also, we have been working closely with Swadlincote Litter Pickers.

Following recent reports of attempted burglary in Willington, Officers have held engagement events in the community to share crime prevention information. Safer Homes and Neighbourhood Watch have also been on board sharing information to reassure people of the local area.

Investigation is still underway in relation to those attempted burglaries and Officers are awaiting forensics.

High profile after-dark patrols have been carried out with positive outcomes in the area.

Speed check operations have been carried out and numerous vehicles have been seized for having no insurance and/or no licences throughout the area.

A number of Section 59 notices have been given out to individuals driving in an anti-social manner in the Willington and Mercia area.

A drink-driver has been charged following a road traffic collision in Stenson Lock.

The Community Speed Watch Group in Repton, started on Burton Road catching people at a rate of 20 every hour which has now dropped to 2 or 3 per hour due to the great visibility and work of this group. There are groups also meeting in Findern and Smisby, with the interest of a group starting in Willington too.

We helped out the Road Traffic Police with Drink Drive checks as part of the Christmas campaign.

Targeted patrols have been completed alongside the Rural Crime Team throughout the rural locations of the area looking at hare coursing, poaching etc.

Our SNT have taken positive action with those causing the ASB along with seizing E-Scooters.

Knife sweeps have been carried out as part of Operation Sceptre (a national week of action in order to help tackle knife crime) in our area whereby no knives were found.

There have been reports of a gang throwing eggs off the bridge over the A50 near Stenson Fields. Nine individuals have been identified and dealt with positively by our SNT, the Council and the local school.



A prolific shop lifter has been sentenced to 12 months in prison, having committed numerous offenses in South Derbyshire.

We will continue to share our updates on our Facebook page.

Chair, Councillor Churchill noted the support for tackling speeding and thanked all those involved.

Debbie Punter explained PCSO Marley had answered a pre-submitted question through his update.

Councillor Ford explained that the Parish Councils can now apply to get Speed Indicators for a 12-month trial and expressed he will pledge for all his parishes who apply.

3. South Derbyshire Community Safety Partnership/ Safer Neighbourhood Grants Update

Chris Smith gave the following update: -

Foremark Reservoir

Meetings have taken place as it is expected to be busy again this year and action has been taken in preparation for the good weather with permanent fencing being erected inside the site and additional double yellow lines added in other areas.

Harebell Lane

A number of discarded needles have been found in a small-wooded area on Harebell Lane just off Earls Drive, Stenson Fields. Our Community Safety Enforcement Officers (CSEO's) have been out and spoken with local residents, the needles been cleaned up and this will be monitored in due course.

Fly Tipping

There was a big fly tip yesterday (23.03.22) on Lowes Lane which was cleaned up immediately by SDDC and an investigation is now taking place to find the perpetrator.

ASB Warning Letters

In terms of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Claire Rawlins, our ASB Officer has been working closely with Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) issuing warning letters to young people who are causing ASB in the area. A couple of youth related issues have been dealt with in this area, young people causing issues in the town centre and a separate group throwing eggs onto the A50. Both groups have been identified with Claire and the Police issuing warnings and parents have been visited. Since this, no members of the group have raised their heads.

Police Community Engagement Events



Debbie Punter, our Community Safety Officer has been supporting the police with the Community Engagement Events around the District, as has Mark from the Safer Homes Scheme picking up referrals and offering people security advice. Offering residence with Community Safety Advice and dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour complaints at such events.

New Communities Team Service Assistant

Following interviews held earlier this month the Communities Team has appointed Rosie Collins to the role of Service Assistant. Rosie previously worked as a Sports Casual for several years and will join the team on 5 April, taking over from Debbie who has moved into a new role as Community Safety Officer.

New Partnership Vehicles

Two new vehicles are being supplied by Toyota for use by our local Safer Neighbourhood Team. The vehicles which should arrive in the next few weeks will replace the existing two old vehicles and will be maintained by the District Council.

School Banners

Going forward, we will be purchasing some banners for the SNT to give out to local primary schools to remind parents to park considerately at drop off and pick up times.

Safer Neighbourhoods and Community Funding

There has been no new applications received since the last meeting and there is now money available for next financial year. If there are any ideas for new projects which could impact on ASB, community engagement or Crime and Disorder, please do not hesitate to contact Chris or Debbie.

Chair, Councillor Churchill explained he was at Foremark Reservoir, the gates close at 4pm but at 6pm cars were still there and had drove up and around the gates as the wooden fencing is no longer there and needs fixing.

ACTION: Chris Smith to feedback about fencing at Foremark Reservoir.

Councillor Shepherd commented on the needles found on Harebell Lane, as it is a concern within the area.

Chris Smith updated that there is no more information that can be given at the moment but the Council and SNT together will do their upmost to keep an eye on this.

4. Local community and voluntary sector projects/ update

Roger Moors provided the following service update: -

Active Travel



This service supports people who have no transport and are unable to use public transport to take them to medical appointments - GP, Hospital, Vaccinations. The service is still limited as we do not have too many drivers active, and we are being careful about the number of passenger journeys drivers undertake per day. We are only doing Hospital and GP appointments at the moment as we have to prioritise the journeys for health appointments. Drivers and Service Users are expected to still where masks, socially distance and use hand sanitiser to keep everybody safe. We will not transport anyone with any symptoms of Covid 19 and our drivers will not drive if they have any symptoms.

Befriending

Since March 2020 our Befriending Service has been carried out through telephone calls. Some face-to-face visits have started but this is dependent on many factors the befriendee, the volunteer and some processes. We have to check that this is safe for both parties and carry out new risk assessments. Some volunteers, who started volunteering in the last year telephone befriending, also need to go through extra checks and training before being able to start face to face visits. This takes time and we again need to do this before permitting people to start visiting in person. Please bear with us while we do this.

Home From Hospital

This scheme has been continuing to support people throughout the pandemic. We have been helping people with shopping and prescription/ medication collection doing doorstep deliveries and these are continuing too. In addition, Rachel Stilwell our Service Coordinator has been supporting people with other things that help to keep them home from hospital. We are beginning to plan to introduce home visits again, but we will be doing so with caution and with procedures in place to keep everyone involved safe.

Safer Homes

This service has been open again since April last year and visits were resumed to ensure people's homes are safe and secure and advise them on measures to improve security and to install locks etc to helps this. Our operative continues to wear PPE, maintains social distance and follows safety measures and cleaning procedures before, during and after his visits. Referrals to this service are often from Police and professionals although self-referral



is possible. We deliver Safer Homes in South Derbyshire District Council area and Erewash.

<u>Food Bank</u>

Our Food Bank is now operating from Hill St Baptist Church in Swadlincote, and collection of food parcels is by appointment only on Monday, Tuesday and Thursday from 8am - 3:30pm. Please telephone 07458 305314 (**please note this number is for food bank enquiries only**, for general CVS enquiries call 01283 219761) or email <u>projectsupport@sdcvs.org.uk</u> to arrange an appointment. If emailing, please include your telephone number with your message so we can get back to you as soon as possible.

The service provides free emergency food parcels to families and individuals in the South Derbyshire area. We also have a fridge and freezer so are also able to support service users with fresh food donated by local businesses.

Anyone who needs emergency food can access the service. On the first occasion that you need a parcel, you can refer yourself to the service. For each food parcel after that, you will need to provide a referral form before you will be given a parcel.

<u>Covid Connectors Project – to set up a Covid Connectors Network throughout South</u> <u>Derbyshire</u>

This is used to empower residents and workforces in South Derbyshire with the information they need to lead the way in the community by giving consistent, timely and accurate information around Covid-19. Since January 2021 the team have been working with 32 Covid Connectors. Through these networks, Covid related information has been shared with the Connectors who then disseminate the information to their local communities. The funding has now been extended until December 2022 and will be focusing more on health and wellbeing and moving into recovery from the pandemic. Connected South Derbyshire

A new project to connect citizens of South Derbyshire to their local communities and to end loneliness. • We have been looking at using the different community magazines which have an enormous reach out to local people in South Derbyshire. Will update at the next meeting how this is going.

Chair, Councillor Churchill explained with the Cost-of-Living Crisis, people in work are also going to struggle. With this, elsewhere in the Country, there is a programme being ran where people can do their food shop for £7 per week with the perfectly healthy waste food from Supermarkets.

Roger explained, this is the Pantry Programme. Access to the appropriate space is key for this service to develop.

Councillor David Dickinson asked for CVS's perspective on instructions for Ukrainian Refugees?

Roger updated, there has been actions put in place with the District Council to take a partnership approach on this matter to work together and make a collaborative contribution.

Kevin Stackhouse updated that the government are asking for County Council to co-ordinate with us being asked to nominate an officer to feed into these early stages of planning.

5. Local Authority Update and Public Q&A

<u>Bikeability</u>

The Councils Active Health and Wellbeing Team have secured funding to continue delivering Bikeability sessions to local primary schools for the next financial year, this is thanks to their hard work, dedication and ability to deliver and exceed targets over a number of years.

The Bikeability sessions are a modern version of the old Cycle Proficiency whereby young children are taught how to ride bikes safely on the roads but also helps them to gain independence, social skills and a sense of wellbeing.

After Bikeability, children are better at responding to risk and report increased confidence.

As a result, more children cycle to school which in turn improves mental health and wellbeing.

High visibility items provided by the Community Safety Partnership are also provided to each child who attends the course.

Health and Wellbeing

A new Health and Wellbeing section has been developed on the Council's website, <u>Health</u> and wellbeing | South Derbyshire District Council.

The website is based around the 'Five Ways to Wellbeing' and contains information and support on physical and mental wellbeing.

The site also contains the latest 'Well for Winter' booklet and the latest Adult Activity Brochure.

Airport Environmental Awards Scheme

Our Environmental Education Team based at Rosliston Forestry Centre, are getting involved in the Airport's Community Fund. They have launched an initiative in local schools across South Derbyshire, for the schools to design an eco-garden. With this, the schools with the best designs will be granted a sum of money, up to £20,000 in order to make their designs a reality.

ISO14001 recertification

Following an extensive eight-day external audit of the Council's ISO14001 Environmental Management System, the Council has been awarded re-certification to the international standard for the 12th time.

The audit required the Leadership Team and all services across the authority to provide evidence that the principles and practices of high-quality environmental management were embedded in everything the Council does.

The audit found the Council had made significant advances in its environmental management practices over the last two years with only a few areas highlighted for improvement.

Climate Change

This council, like many others last year declared a climate emergency. This Council itself has committed to become carbon neutral by 2030. We are signed up, periodically to an international accreditation which is a rigorous audit that takes place whereby external assessors comes into the Council and audits what we are doing and our approach; recently, the council has been reaccredited. Practically, we are using government funding to deliver initiatives around climate change, recently the Council has been awarded funding of £2-3 million. This is to improve energy efficiency in not only the Council properties but others too. Whereby, properties are being identified as *potentially suffering* from fuel poverty - the Councils funding will now be able to make those houses more energy efficient.

The second initiative involves installing electronic charging points in car parks. To date, this has mostly taken place in and around Swadlincote. Bids have currently been placed in order to put these points around other parts of the District.

The Council, in partnership with Toyota, have put a bid into the Government, for a National Pilot Scheme of which the Council would trial it's refuse freighters using hydrogen fuel.

Apprenticeship update

The Council has employed six apprentices with a seventh currently going through the recruitment process to join as a Business Administration Apprentice in Housing.



The apprenticeship scheme has given the individuals involved the opportunity to gain real work experience and support whilst completing their respective qualification.

The feedback received from both our apprentices and those mentoring or managing them has been extremely positive.

Our goal is to create more apprenticeship opportunities in the coming months.

Chair, Councillor Churchill expressed the importance for Rural Wards to be recognised for the EV charging points too.

Chair, Councillor Churchill asked when we may move back to face to face Area Forums.

Kevin Stackhouse updated that there will be a report going out soon whereby this will be addressed, a lot is to be taken into consideration with space and people's safety but there is background work going on around this matter.

Councillor Shepherd asked if SDDC are responsible for charity clothing bin in a local open space area in Stenson Fields.

Kevin Stackhouse explained this is not something which he is aware of but happy to look at the matter outside of the meeting.
