4th QUARTER PERFORMANCE REPORT – 1 JANUARY 2007 to 31 MARCH 2007

Issue

To report the 4th quarter (as at 31 March 2007) performance with the Community Strategy action plan 2006 to 2008 to the board and identify any issues and intervention required.

Background

Performance with the Community Strategy action plan is reported using the appended matrix.

The framework allows each action to be assessed/monitored in terms of its position at the end of a quarter (i.e. what has been achieved in terms of the targets) and what the expected outturn will be by the completion date stated. The assessment is based on 3 colours: -

- Green: on track to be achieved
- Amber: at risk of failure to be achieved
- Red: probable risk of failure to be achieved

The purpose of reporting progress in this way is to identify as early as possible any risk of failure of achieving a target. By raising the issue early on, intervention can be applied by the Board in an attempt to correct any under performance or barriers to achieving a target.

Where an action had a target date equivalent to this reporting period i.e. January, February or March 2007, these actions are determined as either green (achieved the targets in full) or red (did not achieve the desired or specified target).

4th quarter performance – summary details

For the 4th quarter (1st January 2007 to 31 March 2007), the following table summarises each working group's reported actions by expected outturn: -
