Brief description of the Project: (eg. target locality, target group and how you will deliver the programme)

Building on the success of Swad Live (formerly Swadlincote performing Arts) in 2023 The overall objective is to generate interest to form a new stand-alone not for profit organisation (charity, CIC, other) to become the recognised and 'turn to' body for all matters pertaining to 'live' performance arts in the town.

Aim: To build on the success of 2023 and organise another big Swad Live event or similar smaller events. Further generate interest in forming a stand-alone organisation to develop events. A stand-alone organisation could develop, promote and curate a range of annual 'live' events in the town bringing to the fore local and regional talent. This may include, but not exclusively live music, performing arts, plays and spoken word.

Objectives:

To support Swadlincote's aim to be a vibrant and attractive visitor destination, complementing existing attractions/events and in doing so bring more people into the town centre.

To aid economic development in the town, in particular support for retailers

To help develop a sense of Pride in Swadlincote, helping to combat low level disorder particularly relating to youth where there may be a paucity of activities to be involved in.

Increased opportunities for volunteering (marshalling, organisation etc)

- Youth engagement Improved revenues for retailers

The need for this proposal was identified by SDDC and SDCVS and the clear and obvious absence of a Town Performing Arts organisation. The success of the 2023 event has cemented the desire to build on what was learned in 2023 and seek to further develop Swad Live.

We recognise that the 2023 event did not garner sufficient interest to form a CIC but will look at the possibility of that happening over a second successful year. Time can be spent on forming CIC or engaging and supporting organisations to be involved in Swad Live. A flexible approach to this will be required.
