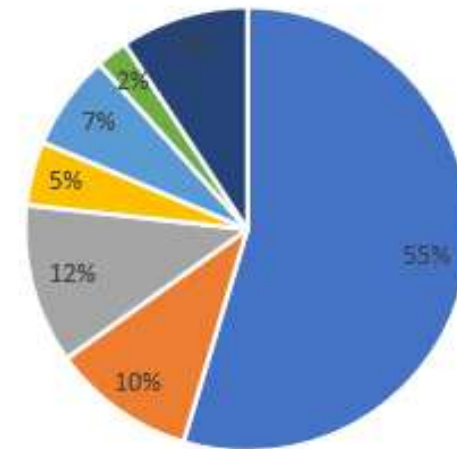

We remain committed to providing safe spaces, information, guidance, and support to our communities in Derbyshire. Our provisions and support are largely directed by community needs, and we strive to meet as many of these as possible. Our goal is to empower young people to lead fulfilling lives and to support communities in being inclusive.

How do we do this?

Through the LGBT Collective:

- Youth clubs - free groups run in multiple locations offering young people and volunteer support in safe spaces.
- Holiday clubs - providing a safe space for young people during half term consisting of activities to empower and promote healthy wellbeing.
- Youth events - annual "born this way" youth prom.
- Family events - monthly get togethers to bring our young people and together.
- One-to-one support service - reaching more than 140 people a m
- Training and resources - free information and support with bespc for schools, GP practices, and other organisations

Through the community hub:

- 0-5 provision - messy play, stay & play sessions.
- Help and advice - helping parents with any support they may ensure their child's welfare.
- Resources - providing age-appropriate resources to enhance development.
- Inclusion - Sen led activities and events, free resources or diversity.
- Promoting wellbeing - through self-defence classes, exer resources
- Reducing anti-social behaviour - working with local aut support and positive spaces.
