1.0 Recommendations

- 1.1 That the Council approves and adopts the revised recommended allocation of seats to the Political Groups for the remainder of the municipal year 2011/12.
- 1.2 That the consequential amendments to the Constitution following the dissolution of the Bretby Crematorium Joint Committee be approved.

2.0 Purpose of Report

2.1 To consider the Council's political proportionality for the remainder of the municipal year 2011/12 following the dissolution of the Bretby Crematorium Joint Committee.

3.0 Detail

- 3.1 The Council's duty to determine the allocation of seats is prescribed by Section 15 of the Local Government and Housing Act 1989 ("the Act") (specifically subsections (3) to (5) as modified by The Local Government (Committees and Political Groups) Regulations 1990 ("the Regs")). A Political Group is defined as being constituted by at least two Members who have advised the proper officer of the local authority in writing that they wish to be treated as a Political Group.
- 3.2 Following the District Council Elections on 5th May 2011, the political composition of the Council is as follows:-

Conservative GroupLabour Group19

3.3 The Council is required to review the representation of the different Political Groups on Committees and Sub-Committees at, or as soon as practicable after, the Annual Meeting of the Council; or where notice is received of a change in the composition of Political Groups.

- 3.4 The principles of determination are as follows:-
 - (a) All the seats are not allocated to the same Group;
 - (b) The majority of the seats go to the Group (if any) which has an overall majority on the Council;
 - (c) Subject to the above two principles, that the number of seats on the total of all the ordinary Committees allocated to each Group bears the same proportion to the proportion on the Full Council.
- 3.5 Following the sale of the Bretby Crematorium and the approval of the final accounts, the Joint Committee will be dissolved. The total number of Committee seats on the District Council for allocation will then be reduced from 100 to 97. After calculating the proportionality for the two Groups, this gives 51 seats to the Conservative Group and 46 seats to the Labour Group, as indicated on the schedule attached at Annexe 'A'. The existing numbers of seats for the Political Groups on the remaining Committees remain unchanged.
