

2. Police Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) Report and Police Q&A

PCSO Kerry Wallington-Waite gave the following update: -

Since our last Area Forum meeting, we have been busy completing our Neighbourhood priorities, these were set historically by concerns raised at these forum meetings but are now decided using the following:

- Incidents reported
- Engagement/concerns raised in the community via our social media
- Discussions and meetings with partner agencies (Community Safety Partnership)
- Derbyshire Alert message replies
- Derbyshire Talking surveys in the community

From the above, the Neighbourhood priorities were and remain for this quarter: -

- 1. Speeding
- 2. Anti-social behaviour in open spaces (parks etc.)
- 3. School parking

If you are not already receiving Derbyshire Alert messages, please sign up via <u>www.derbyshirealert.co.uk</u> and complete the Derbyshire Talking surveys so we can see what matters to you.

There are now various ways to report incidents to the Police, you can Call 101, Direct Message **@derpol** on Twitter, Direct Message Derbyshire Constabulary on Facebook and via the website - <u>www.derbyshire.police.uk</u>.

In terms of good results in the area, your local PCSO has been completing regular school patrols and numerous school talks.

Joint patrols have been carried out with the Rural Crime Team.

Numerous safeguarding referrals have been carried out to the Safer Homes team at the CVS.



There have been a number of engagement events carried out in the local area including, a cycle security event, a Tea and Chat event and a visit to Poole Cottage Residential Home in Melbourne.

Regarding vehicle results, a vehicle has been seized from Derby Road, Melbourne.

A female has been arrested for being five times over the limit in Swarkestone.

We have been dealing proactively with E-Scooters where they have been found.

A traffic operation carried out, resulted in several drivers being reported for speeding plus one vehicle seized for no license and insurance.

We helped out the Road Traffic Police with Drink Drive checks as part of the Christmas campaign.

Speed checks have been carried out throughout the whole area.

Targeted patrols have been carried out in Bolton Moore following reports of ASB from individuals on motorcycles. Signage has now been put up in the area.

Councillor Hewlett thanked PCSO Wallington-Waite for her update.

Councillor Fitzpatrick raised a concern about waiting times on the 101 number. To the point whereby people hang up due to the extensive time spent waiting for an answer.

Inspector Sisman accepted that 101 number has not been great as an organisation.

Inspector Sisman informed that within the Police, a team has been set up in the control room to free up the 101 service. Currently in infancy, a better response from 101 in the near future is highly likely. The new team will take a call and deal with it at source, freeing other officers time for incidents on the streets.

ACTION: Inspector Sisman to take back Councillor Fitzpatrick's concern for 101 call time.

Local Sergeant Adrian Pegg is retiring as of April 2022, the area will be going down to one Sergeant over the Safer Neighbourhood Areas who will be Sergeant Nizzer. PCSO Supervisor Kerry Wallington-Waite is also on hand.

Inspector Mike Sisman explained, he has now boosted the staffing to seven in the SNT across the whole of South Derbyshire. The Inspector further explained his priority is to fully staff the 24/7 response team across South Derbyshire. With a lot of the PCSO's now recruited into the Police, there is now a strive for recruitment of new PCSO's which will hopefully be complete Autumn time whereby staffing will be back to full capacity.

Inspector Sisman informed there may be an increase in crime in this area, which is out of the hands of the Police. This is due to Donnington Park opening up their events and have now changed where they have people camping on their sites. This may result in a higher percentage of crime rates such at theft in your local area as a whole.



In terms of this, Inspector Mike is working closely with the events and Leicestershire Police and will try to put some PCSO's around the close villages and Melbourne area when these events are taking place.

Councillor Nigel Collyer raised a concern about the road leading to the campsite from the event venue itself being without pavements and fast traffic passing by.

Inspector Sisman explained this has been raised by the event organiser and that there was talk of a minibus but is something which is yet to be confirmed.

ACTION: Inspector Sisman to respond to Mr Collyer regarding the roads without pavements surrounding the events at Donnington Park.

Councillor Hewlett thanked PCSO Wallington-Waite and Inspector Sisman for their help.

3. South Derbyshire Community Safety Partnership/ Safer Neighbourhood Grants Update

Claire Rawlins gave the following update: -

Police Community Engagement Events

Debbie Punter, our Community Safety Officer has been supporting the police with the Community Engagement Events around the District, as has Mark from the Safer Homes Scheme picking up referrals and offering people security advice. Offering residence with Community Safety Advice and dealing with Anti-Social Behaviour complaints at such events.

ASB Warning Letters

In terms of Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB) Claire Rawlins, our ASB Officer has been working closely with the Safer Neighbourhood Team (SNT) issuing warning letters to young people who are causing ASB in the area. A couple of youth related issues have been dealt with in this area, young people causing issues in the town centre and a separate group throwing eggs onto the A50. Both groups have been identified with Claire and the Police issuing warnings and parents have been visited. Since this, no members of the group have raised their heads.

New Communities Team Service Assistant

Following interviews held earlier this month the Communities Team has appointed Rosie Collins to the role of Service Assistant. Rosie previously worked as a Sports Casual for several years and will join the team on 5 April, taking over from Debbie Punter who has moved into a new role as Community Safety Officer.

New Partnership Vehicles



Two new vehicles are being supplied by Toyota for use by our local Safer Neighbourhood Team. The vehicles which should arrive in the next few weeks will replace the existing two old vehicles and will be maintained by the District Council.

Schools Banners

We are going to be purchasing some banners for SNT to give out to Primary Schools to remind parents about being considerate when parking at drop off times.

Safer Neighbourhoods and Community Funding

There has been no new applications received since the last meeting, £2000 has been spent this year so far by this area and there is now money available for next financial year. If there are any ideas for new projects which could impact on ASB or Crime and Disorder, please do not hesitate to contact Chris or Debbie.

Councillor Hewlett raised a concern for the litter on roadside verges in the local area. He asked if it would be possible to put a hidden camera in, in order to gather the registration number of the cars from which litter is thrown in order to go forth with prosecution.

Claire Rawlins explained that in terms of a camera, it would not be feasible. Due to the time it would take to go through the CCTV. What is asked, if an individual see's a vehicle whereby litter is being thrown from, ring into the enforcement officers with the details and it can be dealt with that way.

Councillor Hewlett thanked Claire for her update and response.

4. Local Community and Voluntary Sector Projects/ Update

Liz Gumbley gave the following South Derbyshire CVS (SDCVS) Service Update: -

Active Travel

This service supports people who have no transport and are unable to use public transport to take them to medical appointments - GP, Hospital, Vaccinations. The service is still limited as we do not have too many drivers active, and we are being careful about the number of passenger journeys drivers undertake per day. We are only doing Hospital and GP appointments at the moment as we have to prioritise the journeys for health appointments. Drivers and Service Users are expected to still where masks, socially distance and use hand sanitiser to keep everybody safe. We will not transport anyone with any symptoms of Covid 19 and our drivers will not drive if they have any symptoms.

Befriending

Since March 2020 our Befriending Service has been carried out through telephone calls. Some face-to-face visits have started but this is dependent on many factors the befriendee, the volunteer and some processes. We have to check that this is safe for both parties and



carry out new risk assessments. Some volunteers, who started volunteering in the last year telephone befriending, also need to go through extra checks and training before being able to start face to face visits. This takes time and we again need to do this before permitting people to start visiting in person. Please bear with us while we do this.

Home From Hospital

This scheme has been continuing to support people throughout the pandemic. We have been helping people with shopping and prescription/ medication collection doing doorstep deliveries and these are continuing too. In addition, Rachel Stilwell our Service Coordinator has been supporting people with other things that help to keep them home from hospital. We are beginning to plan to introduce home visits again, but we will be doing so with caution and with procedures in place to keep everyone involved safe.

Safer Homes

This service has been open again since April last year and visits were resumed to ensure people's homes are safe and secure and advise them on measures to improve security and to install locks etc to helps this. Our operative continues to wear PPE, maintains social distance and follows safety measures and cleaning procedures before, during and after his visits. Referrals to this service are often from Police and professionals although self-referral is possible. We deliver Safer Homes in South Derbyshire District Council area and Erewash.

The service provides free emergency food parcels to families and individuals in the South Derbyshire area. We also have a fridge and freezer so are also able to support service users with fresh food donated by local businesses.

Anyone who needs emergency food can access the service. On the first occasion that you need a parcel, you can refer yourself to the service. For each food parcel after that, you will need to provide a referral form before you will be given a parcel.

<u>Covid Connectors Project: To set up a Covid Connectors Network throughout South</u> <u>Derbyshire</u>

To empower residents and workforces in South Derbyshire with the information they need to lead the way in the community by giving consistent, timely and accurate information around Covid-19. Since January 2021 the team have been working with 32 Covid Connectors. Through these networks, covid related information has been shared with the Connectors who then disseminate the information to their local communities. The funding has now been extended until December 2022 and will be focusing more on health and wellbeing and moving into recovery from the pandemic. 5. Local Authority Update and Public Q&A

Kevin Stackhouse gave the following update: -

Bikeability



The Councils Active Health and Wellbeing Team have secured funding to continue delivering Bikeability sessions to local primary schools for the next financial year, this is thanks to their hard work, dedication and ability to deliver and exceed targets over a number of years.

The Bikeability sessions are a modern version of the old Cycle Proficiency whereby young children are taught how to ride bikes safely on the roads but also helps them to gain independence, social skills and a sense of wellbeing.

After Bikeability, children are better at responding to risk and report increased confidence.

As a result, more children cycle to school which in turn improves mental health and wellbeing.

High visibility items provided by the Community Safety Partnership are also provided to each child who attends the course.

Health and Wellbeing

A new Health and Wellbeing section has been developed on the Council's website, <u>Health</u> and wellbeing | South Derbyshire District Council.

The website is based around the 'Five Ways to Wellbeing' and contains information and support on physical and mental wellbeing.

The site also contains the latest 'Well for Winter' booklet and the latest Adult Activity Brochure.

Airport Environmental Awards Scheme

Our Environmental Education Team based at Rosliston Forestry Centre, are getting involved in the Airport's Community Fund. They have launched an initiative in local schools across South Derbyshire, for the schools to design an eco-garden. With this, the schools with the best designs will be granted a sum of money, up to £20,000 in order to make their designs a reality.

Climate Change

This council, like many others last year declared a climate emergency. This Council itself has committed to become carbon neutral by 2030. We are signed up, periodically to an international accreditation which is a rigorous audit that takes place. Whereby external assessors come into the Council and audit what we are doing and our approach; recently, the council has been reaccredited. Practically, we are using government funding to deliver initiatives around climate change, recently the Council has been awarded funding of £2-3 million to improve energy efficiency. Not only the Council properties but others whereby properties are being identified as *potentially suffering* from fuel poverty and the Councils funding will now be able to make those houses more energy efficient.



The second initiative involves installing electronic charging points in car parks. To date, this has mostly taken place in and around Swadlincote. Bids have currently been placed in order to put these points around other parts of the district.

The Council, in partnership with Toyota, have put a bid into the Government, for a national pilot scheme of which the Council would trial it's refuse freighters using hydrogen fuel.

Apprenticeship Update

The Council has employed six apprentices with a seventh currently going through the recruitment process to join as a Business Administration Apprentice in Housing.

The apprenticeship scheme has given the individuals involved the opportunity to gain real work experience and support whilst completing their respective qualification.

The feedback received from both our apprentices and those mentoring or managing them has been extremely positive.

Our goal is to create more apprenticeship opportunities in the coming months.

Councillor Neil Atkin raised, in relation the airport's Environmental Awards Scheme, Nottinghamshire is also part of the initiative, so we are competing amongst the best.
