APOLOGY

An apology for absence from the Meeting was received from Councillor Bladen (Conservative Group).

DC/1. **MINUTES**

The Open Minutes of the Meetings held on 22nd April and 13th May 2008 were taken as read, approved as true records and signed by the Chairman.

DC/2. **DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST**

Councillor Bale (Chairman) declared a prejudicial interest in planning application 9/2008/0168/U (Minute No. DC/6), as an acquaintance of the agent and objectors.

MATTERS DELEGATED TO COMMITTEE

DC/3. TREE PRESERVATION ORDER NO. 300 - WESTON HILL CHALET PARK, BRIDGE LANE, WESTON-ON-TRENT

It was reported that this Tree Preservation Order was made on 22nd January 2008, in respect of a mixed species woodland at Weston Hill Chalet Park, Bridge Lane, Weston-on-Trent. The Order was made as the woodland made a valuable contribution to the visual amenity of the area, being visible from several adjacent properties and public rights of way. It had been subject to recent tree felling and was therefore under threat.

Objections had been received from the landowner, which raised concerns regarding the following issues:-

• The making of the Order had not taken into account national policy.

- Material considerations had not been taken into account.
- There was a strong possibility that the decision would be biased.

Members were advised of comments made by the Council's Consultant Arboriculturist in response to the objections raised.

RESOLVED:-

That Tree Preservation Order No. 300 be confirmed without modification.

DC/4. TREE PRESERVATION ORDER NO. 301 - NO. 10 HOSPITAL LANE, MICKLEOVER

It was reported that this Tree Preservation Order was made on 22nd January 2008 in respect of one ash tree at No. 10 Hospital Lane, Mickleover. The Order was made as the tree made a valuable contribution to the visual amenity of the area, being visible from several adjacent properties and public rights of way. The land may soon be the subject of a planning application and the retention of the tree could only be secured through the imposition of the Order.

Comments had been received from an occupier of No. 11-12 Edmunds Square, Mickleover, which raised concerns regarding the following issues:-

- The tree had a number of branches removed on the side of No. 10 Hospital Lane which had resulted in an uneven distribution of branches.
- Adjacent block paving might have caused damage to the tree and its roots, which therefore could become dangerous in bad weather.

Members were advised of comments made by the Council's Consultant Arboriculturist in response to the comments raised.

RESOLVED:-

That Tree Preservation Order No. 301 be confirmed without modification.

DC/5. REPORT OF THE HEAD OF PLANNING SERVICES

DC/6. CHANGE OF USE FROM PUBLIC HOUSE TO DWELLING AT THREE HORSESHOES, LONG LANE, DALBURY LEES (9/2008/0168/U)

Further to Minute No. DC/127 of 13th May 2008, it was reported that Members of the Committee had visited this site prior to the Meeting. The Head of Planning Services summarised the comments made by Mr. M. Rennie (agent) who had addressed Members on this application at the last Meeting. Mr. K. Wilson (objector) attended the Meeting and addressed Members on this application.

RESOLVED:-

That, contrary to the recommendation, planning permission be refused as the proposal is considered to be contrary to Planning Policy Statement 7.

Councillor Bale (Chairman) declared a prejudicial interest in this application as an acquaintance of the agent and objectors and withdrew from the Meeting during the consideration and determination thereof. Councillor Ford (Vice-Chairman) assumed the Chair for the item.

- b) Development of a children's camp, including the erection of a multi-purpose accommodation/recreation block and manager's house together with a site layout for various recreational activities and the formation of an access road at Fryzms House Farm, Buckford Lane, Stenson (9/2008/0385/M) subject to additional conditions to control the phasing of the development and to prohibit motor sports, and to the amendment of condition no. 16 requiring page of the undertaken prior to
