2	Minutes of last meeting (to be agreed) and update on actions	
	<p>The minutes of the last meeting were agreed as a true record.</p> <p>Councillor David Muller had reported an accident at the Etwall-Egginton crossroads. PC Karen Martin replied that new large, bright signs were up and running. They were an improvement over the old signage.</p>	
3	Safer Neighbourhood Sergeant's Overview / Priorities Update	
	<p>Sgt Graham Summers reported that due to the introduction of a new computer system, he was unable to provide the meeting with the usual statistics he supplied.</p> <p>Regarding staffing, PC Martin was leaving as part of a reshuffle. A reactive unit and an investigative unit were being set up and she was part of the change. Sgt Summers recorded his thanks to PC Martin for her efforts in Area 1. PC Joe Stafford was due to take over on November 8 and a new PCSO, Jamie Gutberlet, was starting in the area on November 24.</p> <p>PC Martin reported a road traffic collision in Hilton that resulted in a no tax offence. A Section 59 warning was also given in Hatton.</p> <p>ASB was down considerably during the summer months. Extra patrols had been</p>	

	<p>scheduled for Fridays and Saturdays.</p> <p>A man had been charged with supplying a Class B substance and had received a six-month referral order in court. A man in Scropton had also been given a warning for possession of cannabis.</p> <p>Councillor Andy Roberts thanked PC Martin for her work in Area 1. He asked if she had got anywhere with a series of van break-ins. PC Martin replied that she hadn't and they remained undetected. Councillor Roberts also asked about anti-social parking in Hatton and PC Martin said motorists parking on pavements had generally moved when asked.</p> <p>A resident said that when an event was on at Etwall Leisure Centre, parking on Hilton Road completely blocked the pavement. They suggested it was worth a look for any officers on duty at a relevant time in the future.</p>	
4	Partnership update / funding / new project ideas	
	<p>Shaun Woodcock reported that £500 had been spent at a youth group in Hilton. It was proving to be extremely successful. There was £3,500 left in the fund for any crime / ASB related projects in the area.</p> <p>There had been a big increase in hate crime post-Brexit. Two hate crime surgeries had recently been held in Newhall and Swadlincote. One was being planned for Stenson Fields.</p> <p>Prison Me? No Way! sessions had been held to show youngsters the consequences of getting involved in crime and ASB by getting them to meet serving prisoners. Six teenagers from Area 1 were on Anti-Social Behaviour Contracts (ABCs) and ASB had fallen dramatically, showing they were working.</p> <p>Councillor Lisa Brown asked if there had been any incidents around the recent craze for people to dress up as clowns and attempt to terrify members of the public. Mr Woodcock replied that there had been no such incidents in South Derbyshire. PC Martin added that some forces had used public order offences to deal with it while others had taken a different approach. Councillor Muller said newspapers had reported clowns carrying offensive weapons. Mr Woodcock replied that it was something the police and partnership would monitor.</p>	
5	Local issues – open forum	
	<p>A resident reported that they had been the victim of a fruit theft at their allotment. "Huge quantities" of raspberries, strawberries, gooseberries and blackcurrants had been taken. They asked what the rules were regarding the use of wildlife cameras. PC Martin replied that if the camera wasn't looking at a house, it could be mounted. She added that the cameras weren't always that useful at night. The resident said they thought they knew who had taken the fruit.</p> <p>A member of the public reported a problem with lorries parking outside Burnaston Garage. PCSO Karen Coldicott said police were aware of the issue. PC Martin added it would help if police knew the times it was happening as most lorries did the same route for months on end and a pattern would help to tackle the issue. If people saw the lorries they would get them moved.</p> <p>Councillor Brown said the proposed railhead near Etwall would soon be rearing its</p>	

	<p>head again. She asked what involvement the police had had in recent talks ahead of the application being made. Sgt Summers replied that it would be impossible for him to comment. Mr Woodcock added that police at a local level like Sgt Summers wouldn't be consulted on such a development, it would be something for HQ to be involved with and as such was awkward to deal with at the Safer Neighbourhoods meeting.</p>	
6	Agreed priorities	
	<p>Sgt Summers didn't agree any priorities for Area 1. He said the officers locally had done a good job tackling ASB. A resident thanked the police for their work and asked for it to continue.</p> <p>A resident said they had run Neighbourhood Watch in Etwall for 23 years and in that time crime had fallen, with fewer and fewer burglaries taking place. They thanked the police for their efforts over two decades. Sgt Summers said neighbourhood teams liaising with the community and partnership working had helped. Complacency would also not creep in.</p>

EA/10 **Apologies**

Apologies were received from Norman Ireland and Councillor Mrs Amy Plenderleith.

EA/11 **Declarations of interest**

EA/12 **Chair's announcements**

Councillor Mrs Lisa Brown updated the meeting on planning applications including one to modernise the old Cranberry Foods Factory in Scropton Road, Scropton.

An application had also been entered to determine the landscaping of the development at Willington Road, Etwall. That was due to go to committee.

Reserved matters of appearance, landscaping, layout and scale for phase one of the New House Farm development was also going to the planning committee on November 8th.

A six-week consultation on Part Two of the South Derbyshire Local Plan was starting on October 14th. An examination in public was due to take place in the spring. A consultation event was taking place at Frank Wickham Hall, Etwall, on Thursday, November 2nd.

Costs of £99,950 were awarded against South Derbyshire District Council for the New House Farm appeal.

Councillor Mrs Brown reported that quite a lot of meetings had been held regarding the proposed railhead at Etwall / Egginton Common. An application was likely to be made early in 2017. Issues of flooding were being considered and a consultant was preparing statements of common ground. There would only be a short window of opportunity to comment on the application when it was made and it was probably going to be 15,000 pages long. The development was likely to start in 2020.

EA/13 **To note the minutes of the meeting held on June 27th, 2016 (copy attached)**

The minutes were approved as a true and correct record of the previous meeting.

EA/14 **Report back on issues raised at the last meeting**

Two issues were reported back upon. Residents were told that excess garden waste produced in the summer could be recycled at the Derbyshire County Council Household Waste Recycling Centre in Newhall. An electoral issue had been reported to the relevant SDDC department.

EA/15 **Public questions on issues raised by residents**

A resident reported notices issued regarding the closure of Hospital Lane, Mickleover, to create a roundabout on the A516. That would affect the Villager bus service, so they had contacted operator Trent Barton and the company knew nothing about it. DCC had told the resident that the notices had been put up too soon. Councillor David Muller added that Burnaston Parish Council thought the diversion was unacceptable and the developer had been asked for an alternative.

Mr Jameson explained that the closure could not go ahead until the S278 agreement had been approved and signed off (this is a legal agreement which must be completed prior to a developer carrying out works on the highway). The closure should not have been advertised as the process had not been completed. The developer had now returned the S278

agreement to DCC and its Legal Team was going through the details, which includes financial compensation agreements with regard to local bus services. Once the agreement had been approved by the Legal Team, the council should have quickly been able to arrange the closure.

Mr Jameson understood that, as soon as the dates had been confirmed, DCC would work with the developer to ensure large yellow advance notice boards were erected on relevant routes to advertise the forthcoming closure (10 day notice period required). DCC officers had requested the developer make efforts to keep the slip road open if possible, due to the disruption and inconvenience it would cause.

The feedback from the developer was that they had been advised by their consultant engineer that there would be a level difference between the existing carriageway and the construction of the new roundabout. There were also issues with a lack of a visibility splay at the end of the contra-flow system. It would be unsafe to allow vehicles through the works area and therefore there was little option but to close the slip road.

Councillor Muller raised the issue of Church Hill, which had come up at a Neighbourhood Watch meeting. 'No parking' markings and a disabled parking bay outside the Alms Houses were worn away. Could something be done about it? Mr Jameson replied that if the road was adopted it would be DCC's responsibility, but a worn away painted parking bay suggested the person it was installed for was no longer living there. It was further clarified that the bay had not been installed for an individual but for those attending services at the church and was therefore still required.

Councillor David Muller raised the issue of Church Hill, which had come up at a Neighbourhood Watch meeting. 'No parking' markings and a disabled parking bay outside the Alms Houses were worn away. Could something be done about it? Mr Jameson replied that if the road was adopted it would be DCC's responsibility, but a worn away painted parking bay suggested the person it was installed for was no longer living there. It was further clarified that the bay had not been installed for an individual but for those attending services at the church and was therefore still required.

The markings at this location have now been renewed.
