Aston on Trent	Yes	Yes	<i>Lengthsman employed on a 10 hour per week contract, responsible for litter picking (SDDC are responsible for bin collections).</i>
Barrow upon Trent	Yes	Yes	<i>At Barrow upon Trent we do employ a parish lengthsman and part of their role is to keep the centre of the village tidy, but they are not solely responsible for litter collecting.</i>
Bretby	No	-	<i>Bretby Parish Council does not engage the services of a lengthman. We rely on SDDC collecting the rubbish.</i>
Burnaston	Yes	Yes, but see right	<i>Burnaston PC uses a part time lengthsman to a very small section of pavements within Burnaston village only (quite literally one cul de sac with 6 properties on it), nothing at the Mickleover Country Park or other areas of the Parish.</i>

Coton in the Elms	No	See right	<i>Coton in the Elms has an arrangement with Coton in Bloom for the collecting litter in the Parish.</i>
Dalbury Lees	No	-	<i>We do not employ a longhsman and I have checked with councillors and we have no litter bins.</i>
Egginton	No	See right	<i>We no longer have a Lenghtsman as I found it impossible to recruit anyone once the last one resigned. We do however arrange two voluntary litter picks each year and sometimes commission an extra pavement / gulley sweep towards the end of the financial year after the winter period. I used to get a schedule of the cleaning rota for Egginton, but it now appears that things have changed.</i>
Elvaston	Yes	Yes	<i>The council employs a lengthsman who is responsible for litter collection within the Parish.</i>
Etwall	Yes	Yes	<i>We employ a full-time and part-time groundsman and part of their role is litter collection.</i>
Findern	Yes	Yes	<i>Findern Parish Council employs 1 Lengthsman for 6 hours per week to litter pick the streets and any land owned, leased or managed by Findern Parish Council, we do not empty any litter bins or dog bins.</i>

Foston & Scropton	Yes	Yes	<i>does employ a Lengthsman for 12 hours a month and one of his roles is to collect litter when on his rounds. The Lengthsman only does Scropton Road in Scropton and Uttoxeter Road through Foston within the village boundaries.</i>
Hartshorne	Yes	Yes	<i>Hartshorne PC employs a Lengthsman to collect litter throughout the Parish including Hartshorne village, Goseley Estate and Lowe Midway. He is employed to work 20 hours per week.</i>
Hatton	Yes	Yes	<i>Hatton PC employees a part time lengthsman working 10.5 hours per week. He does pick up litter as part of his role, but it is not the only part of his role and he cannot get around the Parish in that time.</i>
Hilton	Yes	Yes	<i>Hilton Parish Council has the following staff: 1 fulltime Lengthsman 1 fulltime Lengthsman / Groundsman 1 fulltime Groundsman At present our staff litter pick around the village where the areas have been adopted and on land we own, lease or maintain, we are also responsible for emptying our litter bins but some others are emptied by SDDC and some by DCC I think. We do not empty dog bins</i>
Linton	Yes	Yes	<i>Linton Parish Council has 2 part time Lengthsmen that litter pick the whole village where the areas are adopted and on land owned, leased or managed by Linton Parish Council. We do not empty any litterbins or dog bins.</i>
Melbourne	Yes	Yes	<i>Melbourne PC employs a part-time lengthsman, part of whose role is to keep some of the streets in Melbourne clear of litter (but not dog fouling). Melbourne and Kings Newton is large and so it is not possible to keep all of the Parish clear by using a lengthsman. His focus is on the centre of Melbourne and other duties.</i>
Netherseal	Yes	Yes	<i>Further to your emails below, I can confirm that Netherseal Parish Council does employ a lengthsman &amp; she is responsible for litterpicking the village.</i>

Rosliston	Yes	Yes	<i>employed groundsman who takes care of the footpaths and carries out minor maintenance for the Council, he does not however, carry out litter picking duties, again we have a self-employed litter picker for this role.</i>
Shardlow & Great Wilne	Yes	Yes	<i>The council employs a lengthsman who is responsible for litter collection within the Parish.</i>
Smisby	Yes	Yes	<i>Smisby Parish Council has a Lengthsman whose only responsibility is to collect litter.</i>
Stenson Fields	Yes	Yes	<i>Three lengthsman are employed in Stenson Fields, although one is about to retire.</i>
Ticknall	No	-	<i>Ticknall parish does not employ a lengthsman, and hasn't for many years. Instead, if we need certain jobs done we hire a contractor to do it. We never employ a contractor to litterpick, instead we rely on any litter clearance that SDDC does, and a local team has formed which undertakes litterpicking, which has no connection to the Parish Council.</i>
Walton on Trent	Yes	Yes	<i>Walton on Trent Parish Council employs a lengthsman on a basic contract of 2hrs per week (rising to 4hrs where workload demands). I can further confirm that litter picking within the parish forms part of the lengthsman's duties.</i>
Weston on Trent	No	-	<i>Weston on Trent parish council does not employ a lengthsman.</i>
Willington	No	-	<i>Willington Parish Council does not employ a lengthsman.</i>
Woodville	Yes	Yes	<i>The lengthsman is employed for 25 hours per week, of which approx 20 hours are for litter picking.</i>
