Details of representation (please use additional sheets where necessary) I wish to object to the license request for Grangefield Farm, Dalbury Lees, Ashbourne, DE6 5BH. As a farmer, I'm in favour of finding new ways to generate income and bring old buildings back into use. I do not object to reasonable operation hours (11 am until 11 pm). I do object, however, to potentially having music/bands playing until 1 am, 7 days a week, 52 weeks of the year and the sound of late night revellers. The venue sits in a valley and the wind often drives noise for miles, and this occurring until 1 am and later would prove a huge nuisance to the whole of the local area. Added into this, the increased traffic, and potential for accidents at this time of night, along dark, undulating and winding country roads is a concern. I am concerned also that the venue is looking to serve alcohol and late night refreshments for on and off the premises. I question why off the premises?? The Planning Condition 3 states that guests must be off site for 1 am how does granting an application to be still serving alcohol and playing music until 1 am facilitate that? The potential for public nuisance is certainly very high.

If possible please suggest alterations to the application that would resolve the problem mentioned above, again paying attention to the licensing objectives Limited the licensing hours to: Sunday to Thursday, 11 am until 11 pm Fridays and Saturdays - 11 am until 12.00 midnight. Despite assurances that music will be kept to an "acceptable levels", I suggest that bands/recorded music be allowed until 10.30 pm, Sunday to Thursday and 11.30 pm on Fridays and Saturdays.

Once the Licensing Section has received this form you will receive a written acknowledgement. Your representation will be forwarded to the applicant and/or their representative who may contact you in order to discuss your representations.

This form must be received by the Licensing Authority within the statutory representation period.
