4.1 Members are reminded that at the Meeting on 18th December 2008, the Committee considered that negative aspects of the new complaints system concerned the inability of a subject Member to make a submission when the Initial Assessment Sub-Committee was considering further action by the Monitoring Officer, e.g. training and the fact that any failure by a subject Member not to comply with a resolution of the Initial Assessment Sub-Committee was not an automatic breach of the Code. In this regard, it was agreed that representations should be made to the Department for Communities and Local Government expressing this concern.
