#### 3.0 Detail

# Key Achievements during the quarter ending 30<sup>th</sup> June 2008

- 3.1 The high level of performance and improvements detailed in this report has delivered a range of outcomes for local communities.
- 3.2 The key achievements during the first quarter for each of the key strands of the Council's Performance Management Framework are now itemised in turn, below:

### **Corporate Plan**

#### Theme 1: Safer and Healthier Communities

√ Work on the Carbon Reduction Plan is in progress. Many energy saving measures have now installed in council owned property.

#### Theme 2: You at the Centre

√ Integrated waste collection service has now been implemented across the District.

#### Theme 4: Prosperity for All

√ Steps to actively encourage private sector economic inward investment in the
District are taking place. As a result, an Inward investment folder has been
designed and printed. Funding has been secured from DDEP for Invest South
Derbyshire project, in order to create a new post.

#### Theme 5: Rural South Derbyshire

- √ We are continuing to involve communities in the development of our key plans & strategies. Appropriate consultation in line with a revised LDS is to be undertaken.
- √ Membership on SEDLAP steering group has been established.
- √ A joint JESMIP emergency planning exercise involving the parish councils has taken place (22 April 2008)

#### Theme 6: Stronger in the Region

√ Dialogue with East Midlands Airport is ongoing with regards to minimising the environmental impact of the Airport on our communities

## **Community Strategy Action Plan**

### **Theme 1: Sustainable Development**

A feasibility study to explore the potential for the provision of new business space at Rosliston Forestry Centre has been completed.

#### **Theme 2: Vibrant Communities**

- √ We are progressing the Environment Agency's scheme to minimise the risk of surface water flooding to vulnerable people and property. The Environment Agency will also be undertaking a series of presentations to the Parish Councils during the summer.
- √ A Biodiversity Management Statement produced for Swadlincote Woodlands and 1.3ha of land at Midway Fishponds s now being positively managed for Biodiversity

- √ 4 environmental education events to promote environmental awareness and community cohesion have been held
- √ The Citizens Panel has been used to recruit Environment Forum members. A local environmental group (Findern Footpaths) is also supporting the Forum development

# Performance to the 30th June 2008

3.3 Summary details of actual/ out turn performance against targets set in relation to the current four components of the Council's Performance Framework will now be provided.

### **Corporate Plan**

3.4 There are a total of 58 Corporate Plan targets / actions. This Committee is responsible for 16 targets / actions. The quarterly performance for this Committee is shown in Table 1 below.

### **Community Strategy**

- 3.7 The Council has responsibility or joint responsibility for 37 of the 71 actions within the Community Strategy Action Plan, which is divided into four themes.
- 3.8 This Committee is responsible for 12 of these actions within the 'sustainable development' and 'vibrant communities' themes.
- 3.9 Table 3 below shows that all the 12 actions (100.0%) have been 'achieved' and /or 'on target.'

#### National Indicator Set - Performance Indicators

3.10 In April 2008, the existing Best Value Performance Indicators were replaced by a set of 198 National Performance indicators. Approximately, 64 PIs will reported at the district level, of which 29 PIs will be collected by the Council from it's own data

sources (others will come from other external data sources, such as Defra, ONS etc.) In addition a further 20 'Place survey' indicators will be collected every 2 years and these will measure residents satisfaction with the Council, community, their health and with anti-social behaviour.

3.11 Details regarding collection and reporting arrangements for the majority of these new performance indicators have not yet been clarified. Therefore, it is not possible to make any informed assessment at this stage.

#### **Local Performance Indicators**

- 3.12 This Committee is responsible for 13 Local Performance Indicators (LPIs) of which 1 is an ex-Best Value Performance Indicator (BVPI). Although BVPIs are no longer reported to the Audit Commission, it has been as a LPI for service delivery purposes.
- 3.13 Table 4 below shows a summary of performance against targets within each of the Corporate Plan themes. 12 (92.3%)of this Committee's targets have been achieved or 'on target'.
